CORONER HOLDS JITNEY DRIVER FOR FATALITY

Recommends Legislation to Govern Operation of Public Autos.

New Haven, Jan. 2.—The carrying of passengers on the running boards of automobiles, operated for hire and the overcrowding of such cars is condemned and legal enactment for its prohibition recommended by Coroner Eli Mix in a finding today on the death of John F. St. Clair.

STOCK AND PRODUCE MARKETS STRONG AT PROSPECT OF PEACE

Chicago, Jan. 2.—Wheat prices shot upward today in response to the answer of the entente allies to the four central powers negotiations for peace. Prices showed a rise of nearly five cents a bushel.

New York, Jan. 2.—Prices jumped upward on the stock market at the opening today. The so-called war and semi-war issues being in especial demand, with U. S. Steel at 108 to 3-4, on large transactions.

New York, Jan. 2.—Opening.—The new year began with many substantial gains, based largely upon the course of the international events over the holidays.

Non-advances of the first hour, which ran to over 3 points in steel with 4 to 7 points for the shipping group, were checked by heaviness in rails and low-priced issues.
