BILLY SUNDAY, 54 YEARS OLD TODAY

William Ashley Sunday is the un-abridged name of the whirlwind evangelist, but he'd be offended if you called him that. He prefers to be known simply as Billy Sunday, without any "Reverend" prefix, although he is a regularly ordained minister.

Billy Sunday's first fame was gained as a baseball player on an amateur nine in Marshalltown, Ia., when he was discovered by the immortal Cap Anson. For five years Sunday played center field for the Chicago White Sox, followed by three years with the Pittsburgh Pirates and a year with the Philadelphia National League club.

When Sunday left the diamond in 1891 it was to become assistant secretary of the Chicago Y. M. C. A. In 1896 he started out as an evangelist, and since then has "converted" almost a million people. The methods of the "baseball evangelist," as everybody knows, are spectacular in the extreme. He has rivals in the field, but none can compare with him in arousing religious enthusiasm.

As a preacher Billy Sunday appeals to the hopes and fears, the emotions and whippers, crouches and stands on tip-toe, swings his arms and gesticulates violently. The late Jonathan Edwards had no greater facility in picturing the terrors of hell than the "ball player evangelist." He spells it right out in meeting, h-e-l-l, hell, and does not content himself with vague references to Hades or Gehenna. It is a place, he declares, where all those who have not accepted salvation will float throughout eternity, and the manner in which he tells you of this eternal suffering convinces you that he is absolutely sincere in what he says.

LONG CONTESTED ESTATE SETTLED

Middletown, Nov. 17.—Announcement has been made here that the contest over the will of Mrs. Anne E. Harris of this city, who died about a year ago leaving her estate of \$20,000 to charity, has been settled. The terms of the settlement were not made public.

Under the will the Middlesex hospital and North Congregational church of this city and the Moody school in Northfield, Mass., were named as beneficiaries. Nephews and nieces of Mrs. Harris appealed to the superior court following the probating of the will in October, 1916, and the case had been assigned for trial next Tuesday. Three of the relatives are Burton N. Blatchley and Little Crane, both of New Haven, and Charles E. Scranton of Meriden. The others live outside the state.
