orator that said machines were of good work-  
ing and were valuable machines. That af-  
ter much talk on the part of said agent, the  
orator bargained for two of said machines,  
and for the price of seventy dollars each,  
being one hundred and forty dollars for both,  
as appears by the contract in writing attach-  
ed to orator's petition, and made a part of  
the same. And the orator says that he exe-  
cuted and delivered to said agent his note on  
said 28th day of June, A. D. 1874, for the  
sum of one hundred and forty dollars, and  
payable to the order of C. B. Mahan, Agt.,  
ninety days after date, at Wells River Nation-  
al Bank, Wells River, Vt. That said note was  
by said agent, dated June 1, 1874, but why it  
was dated back orator does not know but be-  
lieves for some fraudulent purpose and object.  
That it was agreed, that said machines were  
to be forwarded and sent to the orator, imme-  
diately, at Boltonville depot in said town of  
Newbury, and that if they were not so sent,  
deposited within one week from said 28th day  
of June, 1874. That said agent agreed that said  
note (though payable upon its face without  
consideration) should at all times be good,  
and become payable except agreeably to the terms  
and considerations specified and set forth in  
the said written contract. And the orator  
charges in said bill that he believes said  
C. B. Mahan is the person who made and sig-  
ned said contract, and to whom said note is  
made payable, is the man who carried out the  
purchase, and that it was not the intention of  
the said Granite Agricultural Works, their  
agent, nor said C. B. Mahan, to deliver said  
machines, but that they intended to sell or  
negotiate said note while current, and compel  
the orator to pay said note, contrary to said  
contract and agreement, without receiving  
said machines to orator. And further set-  
ting forth that said C. B. Mahan is endeavor-  
ing to sell and transfer said note and that the  
he (Mahan) has for that purpose sent said  
note to the said National Bank of Newbury  
and in whose possession said note now is, to  
be sold and discounted while current, so that  
the orator may be compelled to pay the same  
without receiving said machines, and in di-  
rect violation of said contract and agreement.  
That said note, orator has been informed and  
believes, was left at said Bank for the afore-  
said purpose and object, on the same day said


