CITY NEWS IN BRIEF

This is Monday in the Supreme Court.
Miss Mary Bennett, of Shelton, is visiting in the city.

The local fishermen are making some good hauls of smelt and salmon trout these mornings.

H. D. Bilger and wife left Wednesday for Los Angeles, Cal., to make that city their future home.

A. H. Wilson and family of Troy, Mo., are guests of Mr. and Mrs. Jos. Cottle, of East Fourth street.

Col. Chas. Shute and wife, from the old day State, were in our city Saturday, on a visit to his cousin, Geo. N. Shute, whom he had not seen for over half a century.

Gov. Mead has offered a reward of \$500 for the apprehension, arrest and conviction of the person or persons, now unknown, who murdered Henry White on the 22d of last June, near the town of Swafford, in Lewis county.

While the state equalization board reduced the Thurston county assessment nearly half a million dollars, the last Legislature renders it necessary to raise the state ratio to over seven mills.

It is rumored that Adjutant General James A. Drain, who has served in that capacity many years, will soon resign, to accept an appointment as consul to some South American port.

A judgment for over \$40,000 is given E. J. Dyer against the Middle Kittitas Irrigation District, under the direction of the Supreme Court in an opinion "handed down" by Dyer.

The County Commissioners have approved the plans submitted for the lower bridge, across the mudflats, at Tumwater. It is to be a 60-foot Howe truss across the channel to be raised five feet above the present level.
