

STATE TRAINING SCHOOL GIRLS ARE CHARMING FARMERETTES

TWO HUNDRED DELEGATES OF THE FEDERATED WOMEN'S CLUBS VISIT INSTITUTION AND FIND INMATES HEALTHY AND HAPPY.

They are farmerettes and proud of it, those 100 and more girls who are living at the State Training School at Grand Mound. And they are brimful of health and spirits as even the most pessimistic delegate to the convention of the Washington State Federation of Women's clubs had to admit when the whole convention, some 200 strong, was piloted through the big farm Friday afternoon, writes Florence Logan in the Seattle Post-Intelligencer.

The long line of automobiles bearing the delegates moved in procession from the administration hall at the entrance, to the big barn where the mild-eyed milk cows, gentle work horses, sleek porkers, busy white chickens, important looking geese, rabbits and all were declared to be without flaw. The visitors were next guided to the gardens, where young agriculturists armed with weeders were at war against unwelcome intruders in the onion patch. Clad in loose bloomers and middies of a neutral blue gray color, the girls sat on the ground, handling their implements with dexterity.

Almost without exception the girls were hatless, and their faces as well as their bare arms were burned brown. Some of the delegates remonstrated at the girls' hatless condition, fearing that their eyes would be ruined. The little head farm lady, a graduate of Washington State college, assured the visitors that the girls had hats to wear if they wished, but they preferred to go without. "We even have to make them wear their coats when it rains," she said.

Some of the visitors recalled that the day before Miss Ethel Hunley Coldwell, dean of women at the University of Washington, had said, "Girls will be girls everywhere. They will wear thin-soled pumps out in the rain."

So probably the farmerettes are very like other girls. Anyway statistics show that very few of them have eye trouble. The girls sang as they worked, and for the visitors' benefit gave some lusty yells about the "girls of the S. T. S."

Two cottages and the administration hall provide living quarters. The "cottages" are beautiful two-story buildings of cream-colored brick with red tiled roofs. Indoors the floors are highly polished, the ceilings beamed, the walls of white plaster. Furnishings are simple. The sleeping rooms are small, and because of over-population some intended for one bed contain three. The walls are gay with pictures universally dear to girl hearts. On the bureaus are fem-

nine knickknacks. White curtains conceal the bars at the windows. Completing this inspection, the visitors were invited to the administration hall, where each was presented with a boutonniere of wild flowers gathered in the vicinity. An honor girl with voice of wonderful sweetness entertained with her singing. Administration hall, it was explained is the goal of every girl in the school. As soon as she earns 150 credits she is advanced to an honor girl and gets to live where there are no bars.

The course of study during the nine school months includes grade and high school work. Besides the farm work at which each girl has a chance, there is industrial training suited to individual needs. On exhibit Friday was a wide variety of exquisitely fine handwork for which the girls were taking orders. Crocheted yokes and edgings, tatting and embroidery as well as made-up garments, were much admired.

Girls from 13 to 18 years of age are admitted. They may be paroled and placed in outside positions whenever they qualify. But until they are 21 they report to their matron, who mothers them until they reach their majority.

The Last Appeal FOR FOSTER PARENTS FOR 60,000 FRENCH WAR ORPHANS

One of the most appealing of the after-the-war campaigns will be launched this month, asking for foster parents for 60,000 little war orphans of France. Mrs. Walter S. Brewster, wife of the Roumanian consul to Chicago, chairman of the Chicago committee and vice-president of the National Committee of the Fatherless Children of France, has charge of the promotion of this campaign.

Mrs. Brewster has just returned from a tour of investigation through the devastated regions of France.

The highest French officials provided her with military escort and bestowed upon her every courtesy during her visit to the war zone. She lived with the appalling conditions of these children and their mothers— "over there" are undernourished, starving, and succumbing to sickness. "In all the northern country," says Mrs. Brewster, "there is no village untouched, and scarcely a house with a roof. There is not a bridge that has not been dynamited, a factory that has not been ruined. The tales that are told of the boche invasion are unthinkable—shocking. Still the people of the north tell them dispassionately. They have borne so much they have no energy to show excitement over their suffering."

"They are coming back into these terrible towns as soon as they are allowed. They bring their possessions with them in two string bags, usually. Possibly they have enough to fill a red cotton tablecloth knotted at the corners. To Cambria, 17,000 out of a pre-war population of 29,000 have returned. They live ten and twelve in a room, and many of the rooms have no roofs."

"For two days we motored over this northern country before we saw a cow, a chicken or a horse. The country is stripped bare of everything that makes it livable. But to the French it is still lovable. As you ride through it your pity for France is infinite. But in your mind are no words to express your feelings toward Germany. There are miles and miles of grayish-brown dust where were fertile farms, pleasant villages, forests and orchards. About Verdun, as far as you can see, are heaps of sand, no sign of life that was, no promise of any life to come."

"Here and there is a cross where some soldier, killed in the last days of the fighting, is buried. "Those who died in the frightfulness of the earlier battles lie somewhere beneath that awful heap of dust. All along this strip of dead country are soldiers' graves, singly in the middle of plowed fields, in groups along the roads, or row after row in some field cemetery. The fathers of many of the little children for whom we are seeking to care are buried there, and more have left no trace."

Every day of her stay in the war zone it was made vividly clear to Mrs. Brewster that "we must work harder and faster than ever before," for
