

QUACKLESS DUCK NO WIMMER EITHER



The "quackless" and waterless duck has arrived. It is of the Muscovy type and is being shown at the poultry shows in California by Mrs. Anne E. Fray of San Francisco. It is said the "quackless" duck is a better egg producer than other breeds laying almost continuously. It requires little water—being content to drink like a chicken and wander a poultry runway.

States Department of Agriculture. For a flock of 50 to 60 fowls a dust box 3X5 feet or 4X4 feet will generally be found large enough, and should be placed where it can be reached by sunlight during as much of the day as possible.

Fine, light, dry dust is the best kind with which to fill the box, but sandy loam is good. Road dust is recommended by many, but it is apt to be filthy. Coal or wood ashes may be mixed with the soil if desired.

ERECT A MONUMENT TO PHONE GIRL



Miss Iva Chapman, telephone operator in a rural community exchange at Wellman, Ia., did not live—nor die—in vain. She gave the good country folks of her community the opportunity to prove that they could recognize a heroine when they saw one—even though she lived with them in their everyday life. Miss Chapman was day operator, when the night operator was taken ill with the flu in 1918. She worked night and day—keeping the exchange going in summoning doctors, nurses and others to care for those afflicted. Then she contracted the disease, but did not have the strength left to combat it. In appreciation of her heroic work phone subscribers in that rural community have erected a monument to the memory of Miss Chapman in the little cemetery at that place.

WEIGH CAREFULLY RESULTS OF YEAR'S COST ACCOUNTS

In making use of the results of a year's cost accounts for the purpose of perfecting the organization of the farm, hasty conclusions should not be drawn. Sometimes a positive decrease in profits may ensue if an enterprise be dropped, because, taken alone, it has failed to pay. Cows, for instance, may not be showing a net profit, but if all the cows were sold there might be no other way of using up the roughage and it would become dead loss. Labor devoted night and morning to milking and feeding cows and charged to them would be entirely lost if the cows were sold and nothing supplied to fill in the time. Thus an added burden for the maintenance of labor would have to be borne by the other enterprises.

The fact that the hogs or the corn crop bring in the most net money during the season is no reason for assuming that all the activities of the farm in the future should be de-

are used as windbreaks, as frames be that the keeping of cows is partly responsible for making the hogs so profitable, or that the growing of wheat, clover, or other crops in rotation with corn makes the latter crop much more profitable than it would have been if grown alone.

Similar conditions will be met with on all farms, and, therefore, no sudden changes should be made on the basis of what a single year's accounts

may indicate. All changes of the enterprise should be taken into consideration.
