Sugar Beets as Stock Food.

A considerable quantity of sugar beets have been experimentally grown during the past season in many localities where there is no market for them for the purpose of making sugar, no factory being at hand. A profitable use for the crop from the many small plots that have been grown will be found by using them as feed for live stock. The amount of nutriment contained in the beet is not large, but this is true of all roots and tubers. The value of beets, however, as a food for live stock is largely in excess of that which chemical analysis shows. Their beneficial effect upon the digestive organs during that period when dry feeding is the rule is well known to all who have given the subject any attention, and they are found more nutritious than mangles, carrots or rutabagas, while the large amount of sugar they contain increases their palatability. They are especially valuable for sheep and milk cows, and noticeably improve thrift whenever used, nor have they any injurious effect upon milk, which cannot be said of some other of the roots. Those who have grown sugar beets, therefore, in small quantities by way of experiment, should store them carefully for winter feeding and thus make for themselves an opportunity to continue the experimental work by ascertaining personally each for himself, how valuable they are as a feed stuff when fed as a small part of the ration during the winter. When the sugar beet industry becomes established in this country and enough beets are grown to supply the home demand for sugar, there is no doubt but that the regions in the neighborhood of the factories will become important feeding districts for the production of market cattle, or if they are already so a considerable change will take place in feeding methods. The pulp left after the sugar has been extracted is now largely used abroad for feeding purposes and is regarded as a very valuable feed stuff. It is about as rich in protein as corn silage, with some falling off in the other nutritive elements. It is well adapted to storage in the silo and keeps perfectly, and one of the advantages and aids in the establishment of the sugar industry is the fact that there is no waste, the beet being nearly as valuable for feeding purposes after the sugar has been extracted as before. Those farmers, therefore, who have planted experimental plots of beets this year will have an opportunity to learn how they would like beet pulp as a permanent addition to their list of feed stuffs.—Iowa Homestead.
