E. M. Gard Laid At Rest

On Tuesday, Col. E. M. Gard answered the final summons and passed to his eternal reward. On Monday afternoon, he was stricken with a paralytic stroke which later resulted in death. The news of his death was a shock to his relatives and friends, as up until the time of his stroke, he had been enjoying the best of health. He was widely known, loved and respected by all with whom he came in contact in his everyday life.

The Colonel was born September 4, 1844, in Jefferson County, Indiana, and when seven years of age, moved with his parents to Clay county, Illinois. He enlisted as a private in Co. F., 49th Illinois Infantry in 1861, and mustered out in 1866.

On June 30, 1867, he was united in marriage to Miss Sarah J. Johnson, and in the fall of 1876, they moved to Edgar, Nebraska, later they moved to this city.

Besides a host of friends, he leaves to mourn his death, his wife, eight daughters, and one son, one daughter having preceded him to the great beyond.

The funeral services were conducted at the Congregational church on Thursday afternoon, at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. J. L. Beebe officiating.

Notice to Parents

Regarding Free High School Tuition
Free High School tuition application should be filed in the office of the County Superintendent on or before the first of June in order that the school boards may be authorized by the 2nd Monday in June to make provision for the required tuition.

Note that non-resident students must make application each year.

The town superintendents or principals at Bladen, Blue Hill, Rosemont, Cowles, Guide Rock, Red Cloud, Inavale have supplied all non resident students in their high schools with application blanks for free high school tuition. Each eighth grade graduate in this year's class has been supplied with an application blank.

If you have not received a card you can obtain it from any of the town Superintendents or from the County Superintendent.
