Four are Called by Death

NICOLAI SORENSON.
Last Friday afternoon, Nicolai Sorensen, aged 51 years, 1 month and 4 days, passed away at his home southeast of the poor farm, after suffering a few hours from a stroke of paralysis. He was born in Norway, June 2, 1862 and came to this country in 1873.

For several he years he had made his home with his brother, Yancey, on the farm which was homesteaded by his parents.

The funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at the Dane church, Rev. G. W. Hummel, assisted by the pastor of that church, Rev. Jensen, of Ruskin, conducted the services. A large number of friends and neighbors were in attendance and the church was inadequate to accommodate those present. Interment was made in the Dane cemetery beside his parents.

Four brothers and one sister are left to mourn his demise.

Agricultural Statistics

The following summary taken from the assessor's book for the year will prove interesting reading, and will give one a good idea as to the extent of farming operations in this county: Total number of acres in farms, 2,929,395; acres cultivated, 181,320; acres uncultivated, 17,075.

The following is the acreage in grain and hay: Corn, 89,148; wheat, 44,147; oats, 9703; rye, 173; barley, 136; alfalfa, 19,129; millet, 1,964; wild hay, 19,212. There were 24 acres of pop corn and 553 acres of potatoes.

There were 9,004 head of horses valued at \$850,100, 2328 mules valued at \$242,730, 23,129 cattle valued at \$894,489, fowls 77,571, milk cows 4,699 in this county on April 1st.

The number of farms occupied by owners is 741 and by renters 623. There were 622 automobiles which were assessed at \$32,010 while the real value of these cars would be \$190,300.

Red Cloud township leads the county in acreage of corn with a total of 9182 while Inavale precinct has the least with a total of 976 acres.

Glenwood precinct is the banner precinct in wheat acreage with a total of 4928 acres and Line precinct has the smallest acreage, which is 295 acres.

The personal property and real estate shows an increase of \$543,605 over 1915.
