### Red Cloud Holsteins Mentioned in Test Record

One of the pure bred registered Holstein-Friesian Cows, owned by Starke Brothers of Red Cloud, Nebr., recently made 31.2 lbs of butter in seven days, according to the latest bulletin of "Reported Tests of Holstein-Friesian Cows", published bi-weekly by Malcolm H. Gardner of Delavan, Wis., Superintendent of Advanced Registry of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

This cow, Jessie Ormsby Tritonia De Kol, at the age of nine years and one month, produced 624.1 lbs. of milk and 24.966 lbs. of butter fat, in seven days, equivalent to the above amount of butter. Her 31 day record is 2881.7 lbs of milk and 128.839 lbs of butter fat, equivalent to 128.5 lbs of butter.

Another cow, Starke Farms Angie Homestead, also owned by Starke Brothers, is reported as having made at the age of two years and four months, a record of 448.5 lbs. of milk and 19.180 lbs. of butter fat, in seven days, equivalent to 23.9 lbs of butter.

Frank O. Lowden, former Governor of Illinois is President of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America. This Association has a membership of over twenty thousand breeders in the United States, and is the largest pure bred cattle Association in the world, representing nearly one half million pure bred animals.

### Taken to Mankato for Trial

Friday night State Deputy Sheriffs O. D. Hedge and John Jones, in company with Sheriff Huffer of this city, Sheriff Cole, of Mankato, Kansas, and Mr. J. A. Miller, of Burr Oak, went out to the Charles Minnick farm south of Riverton, where Mr. Minnick was taken into custody by the officers on a John Doe warrant charged with having stolen goods in his possession. Prior to the arrest the officers had discovered a large amount of tobacco in Minnick's pool hall at Riverton, which had been taken from J. A. Miller's store at Burr Oak in the recent robbery. Quite an amount of tobacco was also found stored in Minnick's barn on the farm.

When the officers drove out to the place to make the arrest Mr. Minnick had a number of coats in his car, as soon as he realized that they were after him he started driving to his uncle's place and threw out several coats while on the way. They bore Mr. Miller's name and price tags.

They brought him to this city where Charlie Sutton was also arrested on the same charge. The prisoners were taken to Mankato about one o'clock that night and on Monday the preliminary hearing came up and the trial was continued until October 31st. The bonds were set at one thousand dollars each.

The officers have been working diligently on this case since the robbery at Burr Oak and are accomplishing considerable in the way of getting new evidence. Recently a large amount of this stolen tobacco was found here in the city, and on Monday Mr. Hedge loaded it up and took it back to Burr Oak and also attended the preliminary hearing at Mankato.




