Early Town Records of Orleans County.

(Continued from Jan. 18.) CHARLESTON—The records of Vital Statistics begin in 1823 but are as in the case of most towns in the state very incomplete back of 1857. No records had been burned. No copies have been made from gravestones. COVENTRY—Records begin with the year 1802. Their condition as regards Vital Statistics back of 1857 is not definitely reported, but in this respect it may be safely assumed they are nearly like those of other towns. None have been burned. There are no gravestone copies reported. CRAFTSBURY—No records had been burned here. There are no copies from stones. The records are incomplete as to births, marriages and deaths back of 1857. Records begin with year 1790. DERBY—Here records begin with year 1800. Records of marriages are perhaps fairly complete back of 1857 but those of births and deaths are very meagre. No records are reported as burned. There are no copies from gravestones.
