CONSERVATION PAPER.

VERMONT NEWS.

Supreme Court Again Decides in Favor of Peacham Academy. Among the cases decided at supreme court at Montpelier last week was that of the trustees of Caledonia County Grammar school against S. Blanche Kent. This case was decided at the May term of court and following the decision handed down at that term counsel for H. H. Powers made a motion for reargument and briefs were submitted. This motion is overruled and the case stands as the entry made in May, which was judgment reversed and judgment for the plaintiff to recover the demanded premises with costs and cause remanded for the assessment of damages. The land involved was leased land and contained a large amount of standing timber which was cut. The amount involved was about \$5000.
