RECENT DEATHS.

Morse

The Rev. Charles F. Morse, aged 87 years, 7 months and 14 days, died at Brightlook hospital at midnight last Friday from pneumonia which developed following an operation for internal cancer which was successfully performed Wednesday morning. The funeral was held yesterday forenoon at ten o'clock at the house on Mt. Pleasant street, the burial was in Mt. Pleasant cemetery. Mr. and Mrs. Harry Blake of Hoosick Falls and Miss Lilla Morse of Mt. Holyoke, the two ladies being daughters, were present to attend the funeral. Rev. Mr. Morse was one of the well-known figures of St. Johnsbury, he retaining an active interest in religious and public work up to his last sickness. He was born in Derby in 1825, the son of Colonel Joseph Morse. He came to St. Johnsbury when he was 21 years old and worked his way through St. Johnsbury Academy. He graduated from Amherst College in 1853 and three years later from Andover Theological Seminary. He and Miss Eliza Winter, daughter of Aaron Winter of West Boylston, Mass., were married August 10, 1856, last August being their 56th anniversary of their wedding. Soon after their marriage they sailed to Constantinople as the first missionaries of the American Board to Bulgaria where they served for 14 years. While in Bulgaria Mr. Morse published a Bulgarian-English and English-Bulgarian dictionary and translated into Bulgarian over 2000 pages of tracts, some of which have passed through many editions. After his return to America to educate his children, he preached for 14 years in various Congregational churches in New England and then came to St. Johnsbury to complete the education of his children. Mr. Morse was a man of decided opinions and of the strictest moral integrity and never hesitated to speak against the wrongs of the day regardless of whether they were moral or political and his passing away marks the loss of another of those rugged, fearless characters which has been so distinctive of New England life.

Parker

Mrs. Nathan L. Parker, aged 74 years, died at her home on Crow Hill, Friday morning after a week's illness of bronchial pneumonia. The funeral was held Sunday at 1.30 from the house and the remains were placed in the vault to be taken later to Lyndon Center for burial. Mrs. Parker was formerly Miss Sophia H. Porter, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Smith Porter and was born in Wheelock, where she lived until her marriage to Nathan L. Parker. After marriage they lived at East Lyndon and East Burke and five years ago came to St. Johnsbury to make their home with their son, J. Elwin Parker. Mrs. Parker was a member of Grace Methodist church. Besides her husband she is survived by three sons, Elwin, Ralph T., and Clarence of St. Johnsbury and an adopted daughter, Mrs. Lilla Pierce of Baldwin Park, Cal. She also leaves three sisters Mrs. Mary Weed of Greensboro, Mrs. C. D. Gray of Wheelock, Mrs. Frank McGill of Passumpsic.

Spaulding

Mrs. Freelove Keach Spaulding died at the home of her son on Summer street Sunday morning after a long illness. The funeral was held from St. Andrews' church Tuesday afternoon at three o'clock, the Rev. A. P. Grint officiating assisted by Rev. J. A. Thompson of Walpole, Mass. The burial was in Mt. Pleasant cemetery. Freelove Ellen Keach was born in St. Johnsbury in 1844. On January 1, 1866 she was married to Bethuel Washburn Spaulding and spent her married life in Morrisville. Since Mr. Spaulding's death and for the last 25 years she has lived with her son, Frank E. Spaulding, in St. Johnsbury. Mrs. Spaulding was a member of St. Andrews' Episcopal church and before her last illness was a faithful attendant and worker in the various societies connected with the same. She is survived by one sister, Mrs. R. S. Day of Bethlehem, N. H., and her son, Frank E. Spaulding of this place.

FATALLY HURT IN WRECK

Alvin L. Smith and James Kenney Caught in Head-On Collision

Alvin L. Smith, aged 33, was so badly injured that he survived but a few hours and Engineer James Kenney suffered a broken arm and many bruises in a head-on collision between two freight trains at Orleans last Wednesday night. As the south bound train was approaching and a north bound extra freight were given orders to meet at Coventry, but it was afterward decided to change the meeting point to Orleans, and accordingly the signals were displayed to stop for orders. The south bound train on which Mr. Kenney was running received the order to proceed at Coventry, but the north bound train evidently failed to see the signal set for them at Orleans and passed the station at a high rate of speed. The trains met a short distance above the station and several cars were dumped into the Willoughby river. Neither engine left the track, but both were badly damaged. The crew on the north bound engine and Kenney's fireman saw the danger in time to jump and escaped injury. Mr. Kenney and Mr. Smith, however, were too late and both were caught between the engine and tank. Smith's head was crushed and it was apparent that he could not live, but both the injured men were rushed to this place on a special train and taken to Brightlook hospital. Mr. Smith died Thursday morning without regaining consciousness. His remains were taken to the home of his brother, Enoch, at Lyndonville, and the funeral was held Sunday. The burial was at Sutton. Mr. Kenney is slowly improving.

Traffic on the line was tied up for six hours on account of the wreck. Officials of the road conducted an inquiry Monday at the scene of the accident but nothing has been given out as to their findings.
