Land Sale To Pay Unpaid Taxes.

The NON-RESIDENT PROPRIETORS of
the Town of Barre, County of Caledonia
and State of Vermont, are hereby notified
that the taxes assessed by such Town with-
in the four years next preceding this date
remain, either in whole or in part, unpaid,

to wit, a small tract of land supposed to be

Label for Divorce CALBONIA COUNTY COURT

Whereas, William Gordon Bundy of Dan-
ville, in the County of Caledonia, and State
of Vermont, has filed in the office of the Clerk
of Caledonia County Court, Label for Di-
vorce, setting forth in substance, that on the
1st day of January, A. D. 1912, he was law-
fully married to Fay Belle Bundy, now of
parts unknown without the State of Ver-
mont; that he afterwards cohabited with
the said Fay Belle Bundy, and without just
cause, deserted her for three consecutive
years, and that since the 28th day of Decem-
ber, 1912, he has refused and still does refuse
to cohabit with her; and
And praying that the bonds of matrimony
between him and the said Belle be dissolved
and that he be granted a bill of divorce.
And being made to appear, upon the satis-
factory proof by way of affidavit, that the
libel is without this state so, that a cita-
tion cannot be served upon her, and that
the libellant has made diligent inquiry and
does not know where the libellee resides;
Therefore, it is ordered that notice of the
pendence of said libel be given to said libellee
by publication of the substance thereof, to-
gether with this order, in the St. Johnsbury
Caledonian, a newspaper published at St.
Johnsbury, in the County of Caledonia, for
three successive weeks, the last publication to
be at least six weeks prior to the 5th day of
June, A. D. 1915, and that the said Fay Belle
Bundy be held at St. Johnsbury, within and
for the County of Caledonia and State of Ver-
mont, on the first Tuesday of June, A. D.
1915, at which time the said Fay Belle
Bundy is ordered to appear and answer to
the libel.
