Crop Outlook Stirs Wide Confidence.

Business Men Everywhere See Assurances of Continued Prosperity.

Are Prophets of Cheer Tell "The Sun" Why They Think Period of Uncertainty Is at End.

The wave of confidence, based on the prospect of bumper crops and a belief that unsettling influences are disappearing, continues to make itself evident in all parts of the United States. The following cheerful statements were made yesterday in response to a request from the Sun for an opinion of business prospects from various parts of the country which bear assurances of a stimulated trade activity and a belief in a rapidly returning period of prosperity.

Splendid Outlook, Says Banker! Louisville, Ky., May 10.—John B. Pittle, vice president of the Louisville Trust Company and in close touch with local conditions, sees a splendid outlook for business conditions. He said today: "Fundamentally business conditions are sound and the prospects of a big wheat crop give every reason for encouragement. From present indications it appears that the new banking law will work smoothly and give general satisfaction."

"The effect of the tariff had been generally discounted and has had no marked depressing result as yet. If the railroads get fair treatment and there is a cessation of political attacks on trusts, business will revive with increasing confidence in the future and we will have a real, continuous, healthy expansion."
