St. Joseph's Staats-Verband Convention.

About 1000 visitors were in Jasper Sunday on account of the 21st annual State convention of St. Joseph's Staats Verband, an organization of German Catholic Societies. About 500 of the visitors, including the Knights of St. John in uniform, came from Evansville on a special train and were met at the depot by the Star band, the local C. K. of A. St. Joseph's Society, St. Leo's Society and the Knights of Columbus and a beautiful procession was formed marching to St. Joseph's Church where high mass was celebrated by the Rev. Bishop Chartrand, of Indianapolis, assisted by the visiting clergy from different parts of the State.

There were delegates present from all parts of the State and the opening business session was held Sunday afternoon in St. Joseph's Hall, Henry Seyfried, of Indianapolis, president of the State organization, giving the welcoming address, followed by Rev. Basil Heusler, pastor of St. Joseph's church, who introduced the speaker of the afternoon, Joseph Frey, president of the German Alliance Societies of New York.

The night session was held at K. of C Hall and the sessions continued Monday closing Monday evening.
