## Patoka Township Must Pay.

The Appellate court of Indiana has just reversed the decision of Judge Bretz in the case of the Dubois County Commissioners, where the Commissioners refused to pay the election expenses of an election held in Patoka township to grant a subsidy to the Vincennes and South-eastern Interurban railroad. It appears that the County Commissioners refused to pay the election expenses in Patoka township. The Circuit Court rendered judgment ordering the County Commissioners to pay. The Commissioners appealed to the Appellate Court which last week reversed the Circuit court judgment, and Patoka township will have to pay Ed C. Johnson, Frank W. Behrens, by F. H. Dufendach, trustee, John Lukmkuhler and Ed J. Killian. The Appellate Court says "In the present instance the statute specifically provides for the bearing of the expense of the railroad election by the township in which the election is held." We are indebted to Attorney General Milburn for a copy of the decision.

While some of the local merchants in the small towns and cities sit around and whine about the mail order business houses ruining their business, the mail order concerns are driving away day and night investing 25 percent of their profits in advertising. If all the merchants of the smaller cities and towns would invest 10 per cent of their profits each year in advertising in the local papers, they could put the mail order houses out of business.

## Postal Savings.

Postmaster Huther has been notified that after July 1, 1915 Postal Saving accounts may be opened by mail by any one over 10 years old. This will give persons living where there are no postal saving offices to deposit in the nearest post saving office.

Under the plan for opening accounts by mail, an intending depositor, will apply to his local postmaster, who will see that necessary identification data is prepared and forwarded to a nearby postoffice authorized to accept deposits. The intending depositor then will get permission to forward his first and subsequent deposits by money order or registered mail direct to the postmaster at the banking point for which receipts or certificates will be issued.
