He gave an eloquent account of the patient suffering and devoted patriotism of our soldiers. Stripped of everything except one suit of tattered clothing, covered with vermin, and half fed, they yet make the walls of the prison shake with patriotic songs. The persecution and cruelty they endure he states is greater even than represented by the press.

While the rebel prisoners at Johnson's Island enjoy the fresh air, and a gymnasium for exercise, and have all manner of delicacies sent them from different portions of the North, our prisoners are confined in close rooms, and half starved.

After the address a collection was taken up for the Soldier's Aid society. The prevailing sentiment was that the contribution should have been for the soldiers families and the poor of the city. We hope this will be the distinct object of future contributions until the poor of the city are provided for.

ESTIMATES FOR 1863. WASHINGTON, November 24.—Incorporated statements put forth regarding the estimates for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1865, asserting that the aggregate will be \$1,200,000,000, is very wide of the truth, and fixing it at \$600,000,000 is also too large. The heaviest items are on estimates of War and Navy Departments. The former foot up \$325,534,692, the latter about \$140,000,000. If the estimates for other departments are the same as last year, the aggregate will but little exceed \$700,000,000.
