

Governor Brough.

In our last issue we published resolutions from the 11th Regiment favoring the re-election of Governor Brough.

That there is considerable feeling in the army against the re-election of the present Governor we have no doubt, but we believe that a vast majority of the soldiers are decidedly in favor of his re-election.

Among the Military Candidates proposed are Generals Selenck, Cox, Garfield, Leggett, Hays and Steadman.

We are satisfied that the sentiment of this county is for Brough, and we are only giving expression to it in this article.

The Sherman-Stanton War.

The daily journals for several days past have had much to say concerning what is called the Sherman-Stanton Controversy.

What we wish to say about the controversy is, that the public should look upon it as a personal quarrel in which the cause and the Government are not involved.

General Sherman, of course, has no quarrel with his commander-in-chief or his Government. He has simply a personal matter to settle with Stanton, and we want it fought out on that line solely.

Jeff Davis and Breckinridge indicted. We publish elsewhere the indictment found against Jefferson Davis, for treason, by the Grand Jury for the District of Columbia.

An indictment has also been found against John C. Breckinridge, who, in our judgment, is more guilty than Davis. Breckinridge has not even the excuse of State allegiance for his treason.

Davis and Breckinridge were perhaps the two most haughty, domineering and aristocratic men in the country. They scorned the masses and believed in their right to rule the whites and enslave the blacks.

"COPPERHEAD."

The term Copperhead, as applied to the allies of the rebels, originated, we believe, as early as February, 1860. Some Statesmen of the South, living in Florida, who had attained to a much higher civilization than the Yankees, put two live and venomous Copperhead snakes into a mail-bag, in the hope that the Yankee would be bitten.

Lately we notice that many of the papers which have been disloyal during the war, are very sore to think that the term "Copperhead" should still be applied to men who supported the cause of the rebellion.

We are not in favor of selecting individuals among that party and calling them hard names. As individuals we are disposed to sympathize with them, seeing how they are crushed, and we should be the first to forgive them if they would repent sincerely and vote for Brough next fall.

THE NUMBER SNUBBED.

It is certain that General Sherman snubbed Secretary Stanton at the Grand Review. The Secretary rose to shake hands with the General, but the latter reached by and gave his hand to some one else.

Surrender of Kirby Smith's Army.

An official dispatch from Secretary Stanton states that General Canby had concluded arrangements for the surrender of the Confederate forces in the Trans-Mississippi Department, including army and navy.

We have seen enough already to show that this will require time and a large military force to keep in check the rebellious spirit that still exists. But as this important work—this business of dealing with the rebellion in its last stages progresses, we shall have no battles; no slaughtering; no sanguinary battles; no starving of Union prisoners to report; and consequently there will be no intelligence to bring sadness to the homes of our gallant soldiers.

While, therefore, the news will be important and interesting, it will be relieved of the painful features which reports of battles imparted to it. The work is now before the country of reconstructing the foundations of society and of civil government in the insurrectionary States, a work that will tax to their utmost the resources of Statesmanship, and reflect as much credit upon the men who may succeed as the result of the war has upon our triumphant Generals and soldiers.

It was not known until Jeff. Davis was captured, that the Southern Confederacy was a "petticoat Government."

The Third Series of Seven-Thirties.

The great success of the 7.30 Loan has always been looked upon as one of the most powerful evidences of the strength of the United States Government, and of its strong hold upon the confidence and affections of the people. On Saturday, May 13, the subscriptions were over thirty million dollars, and for the week ending on that day, over ninety-eight million dollars, and in the three months that the Loan has been in charge of Mr. JAY COOKE, over five hundred million dollars. These large receipts will enable the Treasury to pay off our armies as they are disbanded, and to rapidly discharge the various obligations that have been incurred during the war.

The Second Series of the 7.30 Loan was exhausted on Saturday, May 13th. On Monday, the Secretary of the Treasury authorized JAY COOKE, the general Subscription Agent for U. S. Securities, to receive subscriptions for \$250,000,000 of a Third Series, which is all that is authorized by Congress, and is without doubt the last loan at this high rate of interest that will be offered by the Government.

There is no change in the terms or conditions of this Third Series, except that the Government reserves the right of paying interest at six per cent, in gold instead of seven and three tenths in currency—a right which would pre-suppose a return to specie payments, and make six per cent, in gold even better than the higher rate in currency—a consummation most devoutly to be wished.

The privilege of converting the notes into 5.20 six per cent gold bonds at the end of three years, or receiving payment at maturity, at the holder's option, is retained.

The first day of the Third Series opened with a subscription within a fraction of five millions, and the month of June will certainly see the last of the 7.30s out of market. How early in June we cannot predict, but parties who wish to make sure of a portion would do well to be in time.

THE NEW AMNESTY.

The New Amnesty Proclamation, which has been in consideration for some time by President Johnson and his Cabinet, appears in our dispatches this morning. It grants pardon and amnesty, with all rights of property, (except slaves, and in cases where legal proceedings have been instituted under the Confiscation Act.) to all who have been in rebellion, upon taking an oath to support and defend the Constitution and the Union, and to recognize all proclamations and laws of the United States affecting slavery, the following enumerated classes excepted.

- 1. Civil or diplomatic officers, or otherwise foreign and domestic agents.
2. All who left judicial stations.
3. Army officers above the rank of Colonel, and navy officers above the rank of Lieutenant.
4. All who abandoned seats in Congress.
5. All who resigned or tendered their resignations in the army or navy to evade serving the United States.
6. All who have unlawfully treated prisoners.
7. All absentees from the United States for the purpose of aiding the rebellion.
8. All military and naval officers in the rebel service educated at West Point and United States Naval Academies.
9. All Governors of insurrectionary States.
10. All who left the jurisdiction of the United States and went into the confederate lines to aid the rebellion.
11. All persons engaged in destruction of United States commerce on the high seas and in Canada raids.
12. All persons who are in the Confederate military and naval service at the date of the proclamation.
13. All persons engaged in rebellion whose taxables exceed \$20,000.
14. All who have taken and not observed the oath of allegiance.—Cin. Commercial.

INDICTMENT AGAINST JEFF. DAVIS.

WASHINGTON, May 26. At half-past two o'clock this afternoon the Grand Jury for the District of Columbia reported to the Supreme Court of the District an indictment against Jeff. Davis, of which the following is a verbatim copy: United States of America, District of Columbia, County of Washington, to-wit:

The Jurors of the United States of America, within and for the county of Washington aforesaid, in the District of Columbia aforesaid, upon their oath present: That Jefferson Davis, late of the county of Henrico, in the State of Virginia, yeoman, being an inhabitant of and resident within the said United States of America, and owing allegiance and fidelity to the said United States of America, not having the fear of God before his eyes, nor weighing the duty of his said allegiance, being moved and seduced by the instigation of the Devil, wickedly devising and intending the peace and tranquillity of said United States of America to disturb, and the Government of said United States of America to subvert, and to stir, move, and excite rebellion, insurrection, and war against said United States of America, on the first day of June, in the year of our Lord, 1864, at the county of Henrico aforesaid, in the State of Virginia aforesaid, with force and arms, unlawfully, falsely, maliciously, and traitorously, did compass, imagine, and intend to raise, levy, and carry war, insurrection, and rebellion against the said United States of America, for the subversion of the Government of the said United States of America, in the county of Washington aforesaid, in the District of Columbia aforesaid, and within the Jurisdiction of this Court, and in order to fulfill and bring into effect the said traitorous compassings, imaginations and intentions, he, the said Jefferson Davis, afterward, to-wit, on the said first day of June, in the year of our Lord, 1864, at the county of Henrico aforesaid, in the State of Virginia aforesaid, being then and there leagued in conspiracy with a large number of insurgents and false traitors waging open war against the said United States of America, and being then and there the leader and commander-in-chief of said insurgents and false traitors, with whom the said Jefferson Davis was then and there leagued in conspiracy as aforesaid, and being then and there acknowledged, recognized and obeyed by the said insurgents and false traitors as their leader and commander-in-chief for the prosecution of the said war against the said United States of America, for the subversion of the Government of the said United States of America, did unlawfully, maliciously and traitorously order and command a great multitude of said insurgents and false traitors, who were then and there, to-wit, at the county of Henrico aforesaid, in the State of Virginia aforesaid, on the day and year last aforesaid, unlawfully and traitorously assembled and banded together to a great number, to-wit: to the number of twenty thousand persons and upward, and who then and there acknowledged, recognized and obeyed him, the said Jefferson Davis, as their leader and commander-in-chief as aforesaid, but whose names are to the jurors aforesaid unknown, to march and proceed in a war-like manner—that is to say, with drums and colors, with cannon, muskets, carbines, pistols, swords, cutlasses and other war-like weapons, as well as offensive and defensive, from the said county of Henrico, in the State of Virginia aforesaid, to the county of Washington aforesaid, in the District of Columbia aforesaid, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, unlawfully, maliciously, and traitorously, levy and carry on war against the said United States of America, for the subversion of the Government of the said United States of America, and to enable the said insurgents and false traitors to march and proceed to invade the said county of Washington, and there to levy and carry on war against the said United States of America, for the subversion of the Government of the said United States of America, and to aid and abet them in so doing, he, the said Jefferson Davis, afterwards to-wit, on the first day of June, in the year of our Lord, 1864, at the county of Henrico aforesaid, in the State of Virginia aforesaid, did provide, furnish and supply the said insurgents and false traitors so banded together as aforesaid, during their march to, and while carrying on a war against the said United States of America, for the subversion of the Government of the said United States of America, in the county of Washington aforesaid, and afterward, to-wit, on the 12th day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the said insurgents and false traitors so being banded together as aforesaid, to a great number, to-wit, to the number of 20,000 persons and upward, in obedience to said orders and command so given by said Jefferson Davis, as aforesaid, he, the said Jefferson Davis, being then and there acknowledged, recognized and obeyed by the said insurgents and false traitors, so banded
