6th. For cards, sitting pictures, busts or vignettes are preferable to standing ones, as more graceful positions can be secured.

7th. Please give us ample time to finish your pictures, so that we can do so carefully and well.

8th. We guarantee first-class work in every case.

9th. We must invariably have one-half of the cost of photos at the time of the sitting for the negative.
