

Headquarters, State Democratic  
Committee of Missouri, St. Louis, June  
8.—A Democratic state convention is  
hereby called to convene at the city of  
St. Louis on Wednesday, the 18th of  
August, 1886, at 10 o'clock A. M., for  
the purpose of selecting candidates for  
the office of supreme judge, superin-  
tendent of public schools and railroad  
commissioner. The basis of represen-  
tation shall be one delegate for each  
300 votes or fraction of 150 votes or  
over cast in each representative district  
at the last general election for the  
Democratic nominee for president of  
the United States, provided that each  
representative district shall be entitled  
to at least one delegate. In the city of  
St. Louis delegates may be selected by  
wards.

All persons who believe in the fun-  
damental principles of the Democratic  
party as found in the national and state  
platforms of the party, and who are  
opposed to the concentration of power  
either by the government or corpora-  
tions, and are willing to assist in the  
overthrow of all power that is not ex-  
erted for the protection and welfare of  
the whole people, are invited to partici-  
pate in the selection of delegates.

Proceedings of the Democratic Exec-  
utive Committee.

IRONTON, Mo., May 8th, 1886.  
The Democratic Executive Commit-  
tee met pursuant to a call of the chair-  
man with the following members pres-  
ent: G. W. Farrar, chairman; W. R.  
Edgar, Charles Collins, Charles Polk,  
Charles Collins, proxy for John Kem-  
per, and W. R. Read.

A primary election was ordered on  
the 31st day of July, 1886, for the pur-  
pose of nominating candidates for the  
different county offices.

Resolution was adopted that all who  
vote in the Primary Election, consider  
that they are pledged to support the  
nominees at the general election.

Resolved, That the candidates an-  
nouncing themselves subject to the  
Primary Election, be assessed five dol-  
lars each to defray the expenses of said  
election, and that they pay the sum  
assessed to G. W. Farrar on or before  
the 4th day of July, 1886, and any can-  
didate who fails to pay the sum assess-  
ed his name will not be put on either  
the tickets or the poll books.

That the judges and clerks be sworn  
and that they do not allow the ballots to  
be examined, and that they be held re-  
sponsible for the ballots until they are  
delivered at the county seat, and fur-  
ther that they do not disclose how any  
one voted either by number or other-  
wise.

That the judges and clerks be allow-  
ed one dollar each for their services  
and the messengers who bring the bal-  
lots up to the county seat be allowed  
one dollar each, per day, and traveling  
expenses.

That the judges at the different pre-  
cincts appoint the clerks.


