

Headquarters, State Democratic Committee of Missouri, St. Louis, June 8.—A Democratic state convention is hereby called to convene at the city of St. Louis on Wednesday, the 18th of August, 1886, at 10 o'clock A. M., for the purpose of selecting candidates for the office of supreme judge, superintendent of public schools and railroad commissioner. The basis of representation shall be one delegate for each 300 votes or fraction of 150 votes or over cast in each representative district at the last general election for the Democratic nominee for president of the United States, provided that each representative district shall be entitled to at least one delegate. In the city of St. Louis delegates may be selected by wards.

All persons who believe in the fundamental principles of the Democratic party as found in the platform of 1872 are opposed to the concentration of power either by the government or corporations, and are willing to work in the overthrow of all power, as not exerted for the protection and welfare of the whole people, are invited to participate in the selection of delegates.

Proceedings of the Democratic Executive Committee.  
St. Louis, Mo., May 8th, 1886.  
Democratic Executive Committee met pursuant to a call of the chairman with the following members present: G. W. Farrar, chairman; W. R. Edgar, Charles Collins, Charles Polk, Charles Collins, proxy for John Kemper, and W. R. Read.

A primary election was ordered on the 31st day of July, 1886, for the purpose of nominating candidates for the different county offices.

Resolved, That the candidates announcing themselves subject to the Primary Election, be assessed five dollars each to defray the expenses of said election, and that they pay the sum assessed to G. W. Farrar on or before the 4th day of July, 1886, and any candidate who fails to pay the sum assessed his name will not be put on either the tickets or the poll books.

That the judges and clerks be sworn and that they do not allow the ballots to be examined, and that they be held responsible for the ballots until they are delivered at the county seat, and further that they do not disclose how any one voted either by number or otherwise.

That the judges and clerks be allowed one dollar each for their services and the messengers who bring the ballots up to the county seat be allowed one dollar each, per day, and traveling expenses.

That the judges at the different precincts appoint the clerks.


