The Government has issued the one hundred and forty-ninth call for bonds to be redeemed, being for three per cent to the amount of \$19,717,500.

The National Presbyterian Assembly at Omaha adopted a resolution which implies a withdrawal of the Society from the church.

The executive committee of the National Prison Association of the United States met at Toronto, Ont., on the 18th, to prepare subjects for consideration and discussion at the congress to be held there in September.

As the result of an adverse vote in the French Chamber of Deputies on the 17th, on the budget, Premier Goblet delivered the resignations of the ministers to President Grevy, and they were accepted.

SEVERAL indictments were returned on the 20th at Indianapolis, Ind., by the United States grand jury investigating the election frauds of last November.

MAJOR BEN. PERLEY POORE, the veteran newspaper correspondent, was elected to the 20th of the House of Representatives in Washington, with an acute attack of Bright's disease. Late at night Major Poore was resting easily, but he awoke in the cause of uneasiness and alarm among his friends.

The Carowitzki of Russia was installed with great ceremony at Nova Teberkask on the 18th as Hetman of the Cossacks. The degrees of appointment was publicly read to the Cossack soldiers. The Cossacks thanked the Cossacks for their faithful services, and for the cordial reception they had extended to him and his family.

CHARLES E. STUART died at Kalamazoo, Mich., on the 19th, aged seventy-seven years. He served with distinction two terms in the National House of Representatives and one as United States Senator. From 1840 to 1850 he was one of the most brilliant leaders in the Democratic party, ranking next to Stephen A. Douglas as the most trusted leader.

The Michigan Legislature, on the 19th, passed the iron-clad Oloomargarine bill, making it a misdemeanor to manufacture the commodity in Michigan. The bill provides that grocers selling it, or hotel-keepers furnishing it to guests, must exhibit a placard prominently stating the facts, or be liable to from six months' to three years' imprisonment, or \$100 to \$500 fine.

MR. HAYES, the newly-appointed United States Treasurer, visited the Treasurer Department on the 17th, and was presented to all the officers of the treasury's office by Assistant Treasurer Wheeler. He says he will not take charge of the office before next week, as it will require several days to perfect his official bond and to comply with certain other requirements.

It is stated that the convention between England and Turkey provided that British troops shall remain in Egypt three years hence. If, after that time, internal troubles arise in Egypt, British and Turkish troops shall reoccupy the country jointly and separately as the two governments may agree upon. No other power shall be allowed to intervene in Egyptian affairs.

ASSISTANT SECRETARY MATHIAS has decided that two emigrants who arrived at New York with a memorandum, stating that they had been employed by a European labor bureau for a St. Louis labor agency, are not entitled to entry, as the notice indicates that a contract for labor to be performed in the United States was signed before their departure from Europe.

It is said in San Francisco that the transcontinental roads will join a boycott against the American connections of the Canadian Pacific road because they are carrying freight which comes to them by that carried by them for Pacific coast roads, though the tonnage offered by the latter is much larger than that of the Canadian Pacific.

MR. W. B. TAYLOR, confidential secretary of the late Senator Logan for some years prior to the latter's death, has turned over to Public Printer Benedict the englobes delivered in Congress upon Senator Logan, revised and corrected. There are fifty-three addresses by Logan to his constituents, and the book of englobes will be ready for distribution in about sixty days. Congress ordered 33,000 copies printed.
