

How the People Voted.

According to the best information now obtainable the total number of votes cast at the last presidential election was 12,001,337, of which Cleveland received 5,686,614; Harrison, 5,152,906; Weaver, 987,649, and Bidwell, 276,168. This gives Mr. Cleveland a plurality over Mr. Harrison of 482,708.

The history of former presidential elections does not show many pluralities in excess of that given the Democratic nominee in November last. The highest plurality ever received by a presidential candidate was that bestowed upon Gen. Grant in 1872, when the figures ran up to 700,000. The lowest was 7,500, given Gen. Garfield. But the conditions which attended Grant's second campaign were of an extraordinary character, and the result could not be entirely attributed to the popularity of the candidate.
