From C. H. Polk.

Ed. Register:—Trusting that I have not wearied your readers with my former letters I will write again.

We left Salt Lake City about 1 o'clock on the morning of the 21st, and arrived in Ogden about 3 o'clock. We expected to leave at 4, but the train was late, and as it was near day we did not go to bed at all; and as soon as it was light we launched out to see the city.

On coming out of the station we saw in front of us a mountain, which looked like it was only a few minutes walk from the station, but on inquiry found it to be three miles to the base, and ten miles to the top. They call this Mount Observatory. Ogden is a beautiful city of 30,000 inhabitants.

We found on our return that the train was five hours late, and on learning that we could go to Ogden canyon on the electric cars we went, and though we did not have time to go far up the canyon we saw the hospital, but did not go through it. Although they bring the water three miles in pipes it is almost hot enough to burn you. The spring is noted for the cure of rheumatism and other ills.

When we left Ogden it was almost noon, and by 1 o'clock we were crossing Salt Lake; it was forty miles across the lake. They built a trestle and then filled in and made a grade of rock. It is all filled in except eleven and three-quarter miles. After crossing the lake we entered an arid desert, and in the evening were in a sand storm. The engine broke down and it was 8 o'clock when we reached Montello, a distance of 120 miles from Ogden.

We crossed into Nevada on the 22d of June. At Reno we struck the Sierra Nevada mountains. When we crossed into California we struck the timber region. Of course, most of the timber near the railroad, of any size, has been cut. Above Truckee we came to a place called the horse shoe bend. It was six miles long and was not more than half a mile wide. Enclosed in this was Donner Lake, where the Donner family, years ago, perished in trying to cross the mountains when the snow was too deep. There has been a large white cross erected to their memory. We went through forty-two miles of snow-sheds and tunnels in crossing the mountains. There were thirteen tunnels. The summit is 7750 feet high, and there was snow on each side of the track. As we went down the mountains we saw some beautiful scenery, and passed the place where the first gold was discovered in California. About 5 o'clock we reached Sacramento, just six days on the road. I guess I have told everything of interest.



Time For Action.

John W. Gates, formerly at the head of the Illinois Steel Company, charges that of the metal now used for the manufacture of steel rails not more than two-thirds is good material. According to Mr. Gates, by the use of this inferior material the steel trust saves from ten to twenty per cent.

The *Railway Gazette* boldly charges the steel trust with responsibility for the great loss of life through railroad wrecks. Following are extracts from the *Gazette* editorial:

"There is no individual or company which knows better how to make a good rail than does the steel corporation, with its splendid army of experts; nevertheless it knowingly makes rails which break and kill people.

"Specifications as furnished by the railroad companies are totally disregarded, and rails, especially in the new and heavier sections, are furnished with spots in them so full of impurities and so brittle that they must necessarily break when subjected to the strain of traffic. The steel company knows this quite well."

The *Gazette* distributes the responsibility in this way: "First, the criminal willingness of the steel corporation and the companies allied with it to manufacture rails that cost human life; second, the attitude almost equally criminal on the part of many high railroad officers to ignore the plain truths that are being brought before them by their superintendents and chief engineers."

It is also charged that this same steel trust sells to Japan perfect rails and at ten dollars per ton below the price charged in the United States. Yet these men who exact excessive toll from the American consumer; who sell good rails at a low price to the foreigner and inferior rails at a high price to the American; these men who "knowingly make rails that kill people"—these are the "captains of industry," the "guardians of the national honor," the "trustees of God!"

Does it not occur to the thoughtful American citizen that it is high time the trusts which find shelter in the tariff be destroyed and that the men who "knowingly make rails that kill people" be held personally responsible for their crimes?—*The Commoner*.

One Square Man.

Fully the greater part of the Japanese war talk which fills the newspapers, should be charged to the evasions, the subtleties, the deceptions, the stratagems and lies that emanate from the present Washington administration. There never was any administration anywhere that moves by so many in directions, is so needful of deceptions and lies, and, in fact, is so insincere as that at Washington. Therefore, it is the most refreshing, as the Washington correspondent of the *Globe-Democrat* says, (but why the *G.-D.* should have been led that far in the direction of a definite opinion, I can't understand), when old George Dewey blurted out the fact that the fleet is being sent to the Pacific for the purpose of belting the belligerent Japs if the conceit of those little imps gets the better of their discretion, and they attack this country. Which is a statement of the plain facts in the case without any evasive, deceitful or obfuscating trimmings. That may not be exactly the way he said it, but that is what he said. Since then, it seems, the emissaries of the administration have been after him to get in accord with it by calling the reporter a liar. Dewey refused for the very simple reason that while he was not talking for publication, he had said what had been reported. Then it was suggested that he take refuge behind the casuistry of the dual personality, which, under the dishonest custom now prevailing in Washington, is supposed to permit him to deny as an official what he said as an individual, or insist that as an official he is not acquainted with himself in a personal capacity, or that as an individual he

is wholly irresponsible for what he does as an official, and so forth. Dewey said the distinctions might do for corporation lawyers, but they were too far-fetched and impalpable for him—or to that effect.

Then it was hinted that he could deny it and would be believed, because nobody would know. "But the reporter would know. He would know I was lying," was the answer. Those are brave words, and are worthy of historic remembrance. Dewey thus shows himself to be a man who fears to destroy even one man's confidence in his honor.—*St. Louis Courier*.
