**On To Washington.**

That Mrs. Lillian M. N. Stevens, the president of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union, sounded the future battle cry of that organization in this city Wednesday night when she exclaimed, "On to Washington; our nation must go dry," there is not the slightest doubt. It has been anticipated that such would be the battle cry of the prohibitionists and the temperance people for some time past, and this is not at all surprising. It is true that the Georgia convention did not take any formal action; no resolution was adopted endorsing the movement, but that every temperance advocate who heard Mrs. Stevens utter those words was in hearty and cordial sympathy with the sentiment she expressed, there cannot be the slightest doubt. There was every evidence manifested that the entire convention of a thousand people felt just as she did about.

The prediction has been freely made that if the prohibition law shall work well in Georgia, and few people feel that it will not, five years from now prohibition will be made a national issue. Georgia has led the south in this question, but other southern states are following the example of this grand old commonwealth, and ere long it will be surprising if several others shall not have prohibitory laws upon their books. It depends upon the effectiveness of these laws, their enforcement, whether or not the issue shall be national so soon as five years, but the belief is widespread that the sentiment is so strongly in favor of prohibition that the people will not rest unless the laws shall be vigorously enforced. Besides the people of this state are not so opposed to law and order as to violate the statutes that have been enacted by their representatives in the legislature.

But whether either or whether both of the two great parties take up the issue five years hence or not, the Woman's Christian Temperance Union of America will take it up; they have, in fact, already taken it up, and they will push the work until they succeed, no matter how long it may take. The battle cry has already been sounded, and it will be taken up by the members of the organization all over the country. It will be repeated and repeated again, until there is no nook and no corner in this broad country where it will not have been heard. The women of this organization are in earnest; they are tireless; failures only add fuel to the flame of their zeal; they will not be satisfied with anything less than victory, and it is safe to assume that sooner or later they will be victorious.—*Columbus (Ga.) Ledger.*
