ORGANIZE! EDUCATE! AGITATE!

**W. C. T. U. PRINCIPLES:**  
Total Abstinence; Prohibition of the Liquor Traffic; One Standard of Morals for Men and Women; Home Protection; Equal Suffrage; and the Teaching of Scientific Temperance in Public Schools.

The following statement appeared in the St. Louis Republic Nov. 15th, 1907. The editor of the ISSUE has added the comment in the brackets, also emphasized some of the brewer's statements. Beyond a doubt in our minds the brewers are paying "so much per line" for these "interview advertisements."

"The Anheuser-Busch Brewing Association has inaugurated a campaign against prohibition. With the co-operation of practically all the large breweries in the United States, the company will endeavor in every commonwealth to prevent the application of extreme policies."

"We still desire as always," said August A. Busch, vice president of the association, "to conduct our business along legitimate and respectable lines."

"As always," that is as they have in Kansas the past twenty-five years until the supreme court of that state liberally kicked them out and confiscated their illegal holdings. "As always," that is as they are now doing in Rich Hill and many other border towns, maintaining an agency to ship liquors into Kansas. "Legitimate and respectable lines," that is hid lifting clubs, St. Louis county lawless saloons, Sunday Beer Gardens and Wine Rooms.)

If evidence is submitted to us that any saloon violates the law, or is run in a disorderly manner, we shall refuse to sell beer, malt-nutrient or any other product of our establishment to it. That I believe, is a fair proposition."

(Very well, no saloon could exist and pay the tribute money without selling to drunkards, which is unlawful. There would be few drunkards to rob their families, beat their wives and damn their own souls if the liquor traffic did not make them out of boys, and it is unlawful to sell to a minor. We can furnish the evidence that would close every saloon in the State if the brewer told the truth as above stated.)

"The pay roll of our brewery alone aggregates no less than \$220,000 a month. Besides the brewery, glass, ice and other plants in St. Louis, we have six breweries in as many different cities and states, supply depots and icing plants at numerous points, hundreds of auxiliary businesses, coal mines, terminals, railroads and freight facilities. It would be impossible to indicate offhand, the heavy investments of our company or the extent and variety of our auxiliary interests."

("\$250,000 a month," and most every dollar of it comes from drunkards whose wives and children need it, and yet the breweries have gathered such vast fortunes from the misfortunes of the helpless that "it would be impossible to indicate, offhand" how much "our company" has invested.)

ONLY EXTREMES FOUGHT.  
Our success, along proper lines, is of importance to St. Louis and Missouri and other cities and States in which we operate, as well to us. The employees of our breweries and auxiliary industries are materially concerned in our prosperity, and so are those who grow and furnish all the ingredients for making beer."

("As well as to us," yes there is the rub. The brewers are interested in themselves first, last and all the time. How much interest have the brewers in the two thousand convicts they have at Jefferson City; in the wives and children of the drunkards they have made; in the homes they wreck; in the souls they destroy?)

"The war for prohibition is being carried to absurd extremes—to extremes which, if generally enforced, would have evil rather than beneficial consequences. Prohibition is even worse than excess indulgence, as experience and statistics prove."

("If generally enforced," and that is what they fear, "law enforcement." None but a "criminal" fears law enforcement. "Prohibition worse than excess." Yes, for the brewers. That is all the sense the average brewer has. A sober man, in his right mind, worse than a crazy drunken man. Yes, better for the brewer and his fortune for the brewer might have to work for an honest living if he could not make drunkards.)


