TWELFTH PROPOSITION.

HOUSE BILL NO. 6.

An act to amend sections 8903 and 8904 of chapter 84 of article XX of the Revised Statutes of Missouri of 1909 relating to municipal corporations, laws applicable to cities having three hundred thousand inhabitants or over and to repeal section 8903 and enact a new section in lieu thereof to be known as section 8903.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. Section 8903 of chapter 84 of article XX of the Revised Statutes of Missouri of 1909, relating to municipal corporations, laws applicable to cities having three hundred thousand inhabitants or over and to repeal section 8903 and enact a new section in lieu thereof to be known as section 8903.

Section 2. Section 8904 of article XX of the Revised Statutes of Missouri of 1909, relating to municipal corporations, laws applicable to cities having three hundred thousand inhabitants or over and to repeal section 8904 and enact a new section in lieu thereof to be known as section 8904.

Third. On the occurring of any unforeseen emergency, or casual deficiency of the revenue, when the temporary liability incurred by the state exceeds the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for any one year, the general assembly may submit an act providing for the loan or for the contracting of the liability, and containing a provision for levying a tax sufficient to pay the interest and principal when they become due.


