LAW, NOT SENATE, ATTRACTS MAJOR

PROBABLY WILL RESUME PRACTICE WHEN HIS TERM EXPIRES.

WILL RESIDE IN ST. LOUIS

To invite Charles G. Revelle, Insurance Commissioner, to Join Firm and Stay Out of Politics for Awhile.

Jefferson City. If Gov. Major does not run for the United States senate in 1916 he will form a partnership in the law business with Charles G. Revelle...

The governor told newspaper correspondents that if he resumed the practice of law when he retired he would invite Mr. Revelle to join him as his partner.

Recent mutterings of country politicians on political matters have produced some alarm on the part of the governor's friends...

Charles G. Revelle, commissioner of insurance, gave out a public criticism in reply to the reports of the experts who have been investigating the management of his office.

Revelle's statement is a bitter arraignment of the auditors and their methods. He frequently refers to the chief auditor as a "foreigner," and in one place after denouncing the auditor's report he says:

"This statement is typical of the narrowness, short-sightedness and ignorance of the foreigner who made the investigation. Such a man can not dictate my policies nor determine how I shall officially spend the public funds placed by law at my disposal."

Revelle denies the charge of the auditors that he had collected and retained fees to which he was not entitled.

Senator Stone is Silent. Senator William J. Stone declined to express any views on the retirement of William J. Bryan from the cabinet, or to make any statement in connection therewith.

Barker Issues Statement. In a statement issued explaining his purpose in bringing suit against the merchants' associations in St. Louis and Kansas City to compel these bodies to abandon their grain weighing bureaus, Attorney General Barker says that he has been misunderstood.

Corner Stone Laying June 24. The cornerstone of the new state capitol building at Jefferson City will be laid on June 24, which comes on Thursday. The grand lodge of A. F. & A. M. of Missouri, escorted by the Knights Templar will be in charge of the ceremonies.

Revelle May Sue. As a sequel to the report of the expert accountants who investigated insurance Commissioner Revelle's office, he is out in a statement in which he threatens to bring suit against the firm of examiners for damages.

Close Estimating. The crop estimate of the Missouri expert only differed from that made public by the federal bureau by 1.2 per cent, which shows a remarkable degree of efficiency on our agricultural board.

Rate Hearing Adjourns. Another adjournment of the rate increase hearing has been taken. An attack by J. J. McShane, employed by the commission, on what is known as the Oklahoma rate formula was responsible for the adjournment.

No Advance Charge. The St. Louis Audit Company asks that the telephone companies be prevented from collecting three months in advance for telephone service, according to a petition filed with the public service commission.

Missouri Coal Business Good. Statistical information imparted in a Bureau of Labor bulletin given publicity by Commissioner John T. Fitzpatrick reveals that in January, 1915, coal fields of Missouri, chiefly lying north of the Missouri river, gave employment to 9,227 members of organized labor, equivalent to 59 unions.

Under a state law governing underground workers, miners are not supposed to work over eight hours a day and none do. The union scale calls for \$2.84 for a day of eight hours, equivalent to 35 1/2 cents an hour.

Good Roads Day Set Too Soon. Judge I. D. Pond, presiding judge of the Cole county court, and his associates on the bench, will not issue a "good roads" proclamation in accordance with the request of Gov. Major and the state highway engineer, Col. Frank W. Buffum, for the reason that they believe wheat harvest and other pressing farm work June 15 and 16, the days designated by the governor, would prevent a general turnout.

Booster Trip Planned. Before going out of office in 1916 Gov. Major plans to make a trip to the Eastern cities in a special train to boost Missouri.

Such a special train, hung with streamers and properly decorated, would attract wide attention, he said. Frequent stops would be made to address the people and distribute literature.

Electric Rate Inquiry Started. The public service commission has ordered its expert accountants and engineers to make an examination of the property and plant of the Union Electric Light and Power Company as a basis for regulating its rates.




