The Pro-German Press.

(From The St. Louis Post-Dispatch.) Commenting on the latest American note to Germany, the Westliche Post of this city, speaks of the Wilson administration's "one-sided attitude, which is incomprehensible from a truly American point of view."

What is the "truly American point of view?" Is it the point of view expressed by newspapers printed in America in the German language, by Germans and for Germans? Or is it the point of view of newspapers printed in the language of America, by Americans, for Americans?

We have come to the parting of the ways. There is between the German Government and the American Government a vital issue, affecting American rights, American lives and American property.

With irresistible logic, convincing to every impartial person, the righteousness of the American position and the wrongfulness of the German position and of German acts towards America have been defined by the American Government.

Americans must stand for or against their own government. The issue stated by President Wilson in his admirable state paper is the test of loyalty to America and American principles. If the extreme pro-German press, printed in America, is not loyal to this country, it should at least be loyal to Germany.

May be Able to Locate Deep Wells.

The department of geology and the Engineering Experiment Station of the University of Missouri are now obtaining information on all new deep wells that are drilled in the state for artesian water.

"It is hoped in time to collect complete information for permanent record as to the occurrence of artesian waters in the state of Missouri," says E. J. McCausland, dean of the School of Engineering.

The south one-half of the southwest quarter of section 25, township 31, north, range 4 east—80 acres, all in Iron County, Missouri.

(An itemized statement in the nature of a tax bill showing the amount of taxes, interest and costs now due on said real estate for the years aforesaid, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of eleven and 64-100ths Dollars, is filed with said petition as provided by law.)

And unless they be and appear at the next term of said Court to be held for the County of Iron, and State of Missouri, at the Court House in said County on the fourth Monday in October next, 1915, and on or before the third day thereof (if the term shall so long continue; and, if not, then before the end of the term), and plead, answer or demur to said plaintiff's petition, the same will be taken as confessed, judgment rendered in accordance with the prayer of said petition, and said real estate, or so much thereof as may be necessary to satisfy said judgment, interest and costs, be sold under a special fieri facias to be issued thereon.
