Democratic Day at St. Joseph.

Funeral of David Johnson.

The body of David Johnson who died at Providence hospital in Washington, D. C., Sunday afternoon, will arrive here this afternoon. It was brought home for burial at his request. The funeral will be at 2 o'clock tomorrow (Friday) afternoon at the Christian church; burial at the Masonic cemetery.

Mr. Johnson was a member of the Yeoman lodge and of the Railroad Machinists' Union. He died from injuries received while working in the Pennsylvania railroad roundhouse in Washington, D. C., exactly two weeks prior to his death. He was conscious most of the time after he was hurt until the last.

Among those who will be present at the funeral is his fiancée, Miss Madeline Lambert of Jersey City, N. J., to whom he was to have been married October 28th had he lived.

David Johnson was born June 13, 1892, and hence was in his twenty-fourth year. His father was David Johnson of Annapolis. His parents died when he and his sister, Mrs. Elmer Delcour of Piedmont, were children, and they were reared by their uncle, the late Thos. Johnson of Piedmont. Among the living relatives, in addition to Mrs. Delcour, are two aunts, Mrs. A. C. Woodley and Mrs. Anna L. Woodley of St. Louis; a cousin, R. E. Woodley of the St. Louis police force; and an uncle, A. E. Johnson of Blackfoot, Idaho.

David is affectionately remembered by his former associates in Piedmont. His boyhood and youth were spent here and he was distinguished for his bright intellect and his gentle, courteous disposition. Grief is felt on every hand over the death of this promising young man and sympathy goes out to his bereaved sister and the other relatives.
