Sealed proposals, addressed to the County Clerk, Ironton, Missouri, and endorsed, "Proposal for constructing (or improving) State Road, Project 105, Section A." will be received by the State Highway Commission until 4:00 o'clock P. M., on the 3rd day of March, 1922 and at that time will be publically opened and read at the County Court House.

The proposed work includes grading, constructing culverts, bridges, rip rap, wooden guard rail, stone underdrain and gravel pavement 12 feet wide, together with any incidental work on the State Road from Ironton southwardly, a distance of 9.619 miles.

The engineer's contract estimate of cost for the work is \$91,215.41.

Plans and specifications are on file and may be inspected in the office of the County Clerk, in the office of Division Engineer H. D. Griffith, De Soto, Missouri, or at the offices of the State Highway Department, Jefferson City, Missouri.

Sealed proposals, addressed to the County Clerk, Ironton, Missouri, and endorsed "Proposal for constructing (or improving) State Road Project, 105, Section C." will be received by the State Highway Commission until 3:00 o'clock P. M., on the 3rd day of

March, 1922, and at that time will be publically opened and read at the County Court House.

The proposed work includes grading, constructing culverts, wooden guard rail, and a gravel pavement 12 feet wide, together with any incidental work on the State Road from Annapolis, north, and south, the total length of the improvement being 3.387 miles.

The engineer's contract estimate of cost for the work is \$24,777.51.

The proposed work includes grading, constructing culverts, bridges, wooden guard rail, rip rap, and a gravel pavement, 12 feet wide, together with any incidental work on the State Road from Glover southwardly, a distance of 7.075 miles.
