Inspector Will Carry Out the Fire Escape Law. HOW HE WILL PROCEED

It is estimated that by the application of a provision of a law intended to preserve life and limb in case of fire, there are from 100 to 200 buildings in the District that should be equipped with the best obtainable fire escape...

That the law is not enforced is due to a variety of causes, and from the best information that can be had, it seems quite clear that it is the fault of those charged with the duty of executing it.

The amended law, under which it was believed all could be compelled to obey its provisions, seems to have been nearly as defective as before. It is true, as has been stated in The Times, hotel proprietors and others who require a license for the transaction of business will find in November that if they are then without fire escapes their occupation will be gone.


What seems to be required is a law that will place the question within the discretion of the building inspector, whether or not the application of the law should be made. A building may be occupied as a hotel, yet measure short of the prescribed fifty feet, and the same may be true of structures occupied for other purposes.

SEWER PROPOSALS OPENED
