POINTS OF ERROR DEFINED

Government Counsel File Brief in Schofield-Armes Case.

Claim That Military Courts Have Exclusive Jurisdiction Over Persons Charged with Military Offenses.

The attorneys of the Government in the case of Major George A. Ames, U. S. Army, retired, who was arrested not long ago by order of Major-General Schofield, the acting Secretary of War, upon a charge of insubordination, have filed their brief in the court of appeals upon the appeal from the decision of Justice Bradley, under which Major Ames was discharged from custody.

Among the errors cited is that Justice Bradley ignored the fact that the penalty for desertion is not death, but imprisonment, and that the civil courts cannot relieve parties so charged from the effects of such offenses by writ of habeas corpus.

BONDED IT FOR \$6,000,000

Boulevard Line Places a Big Mortgage on Record in Baltimore.

Active Steps in the Work of Constructing the Electric Road Joining Two Cities.

The Columbia and Maryland Railway Company, which is now at work constructing an electric railway between Baltimore and Washington placed a mortgage on record at Baltimore yesterday to the Central Trust Company of New York, trustee, to cover the issue of \$6,000,000 fifty-year 5 per cent bonds, from June 1, 1896, principal and interest payable in gold.

The mortgage is signed by Messrs. Thomas M. Lannan, president, and H. Stanley Carwell, secretary, of the Maryland and Columbia Railway Company, and by E. Francis Hyde, second vice president of the Central Trust Company.

SCHOOL OF PATRIOTISM.

Gen. Miles, in urging an increase of the enlisted strength, says that the army ought to be a school of patriotism, and that with the present conditions of the service only men of the best moral, mental, and physical qualifications should be admitted.

The discussion of the merits and drawbacks of the post-loyalty system still goes on, but it will have a thorough trial during the present year. A stimulus to the case with which papers are prepared may be furnished by the authors, by the selection of officers and yet it is questionable, while the proportion has grown greater as the years pass. One notable fact is the addition of 104 enlisted men to the roster list during the past year, making no fewer than 956 men carried on that roll.
