EX-CONGRESSMAN ILL.

McKeighan of Nebraska Is Not Expected to Survive. Lincoln, Neb., Dec. 14.—Ex-Congressman W. A. McKeighan, of Red Cloud, is critically ill in Hastings, where he went on a visit last week.

Gov. Holcomb went out to see him Thursday night, and reports his condition serious. Mr. McKeighan was one of the most able Populists in Congress.

He was elected in 1890, and re-elected in 1892. Last year he was defeated in a close fight, by W. E. Andrews, of Hastings.

ITALIAN SOLDIERS CALLED.

Men of 1873 Class Are Ordered Out for Active Service. Rome, Dec. 14.—King Humbert hastened a decree calling into active service the soldiers of the 1873 class.

Premier Crisp has refused to accept the resignation of Signor Callenda, minister of justice, who desired to withdraw in consequence of the decision of the chamber of deputies yesterday in the matter of sending ex-Premier Giolitti before the High Court of Justice in connection with the Banca Romana scandal.

The decision was adverse to the ministry of justice.



Wealthy Evansville Young Woman Fatally Hurt by a Locomotive. Evansville, Ind., Dec. 14.—Pearl Daum, an eighteen-year-old daughter of George L. Daum, one of the wealthiest residents of Evansville, was stabbed last evening at the Laclede Street M. E. Church. She was attending revival services. Her assailant was George Hubright, eighteen years of age. He is of unusual height and for several days has been following the girl. A church last night he asked her to accompany him to the altar. She refused and he stabbed her. She cannot survive.
