PLANS OF ENDEAVORERS Program for the Fifteenth International Convention in July.

HOST OF CHRISTIANS COMING

Three Hundred Separate Meetings and More Than One Hundred and Fifty Speakers Already Provided for. The Great Rally Meetings in the Tents on the White Lot.

The program for the Fifteenth International Christian Endeavor Convention rapidly nearing completion. There will be not less than three hundred separate meetings.
