Save Gen. Rivera
It is satisfactory to see that the Senate is inclined to do something to save the life of the gallant and unfortunate Gen. Rivera.

In the April number of The Forum Senator Hear has an interesting paper, in which he discusses recent popular criticisms of the Senate as a body, and comparing the virtue, dignity and decorum of the institution, as at present constituted, with what it has been in the past.

We quite agree with him as to one phase of his opinion. Indeed, we have a great deal to be thankful for when we see in the Senate a few good, brave Democrats like Senators Morgan, Daniel and Mills, able to stand up against and to defeat the attacks of the Salubrious-Botched-Obey combination on our institutions and liberties.

There is not a fragment of doubt that this Government could save Gen. Rivera's life, if a prompt and imperative demand were made, and the Senate ought to have influence enough to secure just that action.

The Trust House.
