MARYLAND VOLUNTEERS.

Rights of the Naval Reserve—To Report for Service.

Representative McIntire of Maryland has secured two important victories for the Maryland volunteers.

While the bill providing that volunteer soldiers in the field shall be permitted to vote was before the House yesterday, Mr. McIntire observed that, owing to the hasty manner in which the bill was drawn, no provision had been made for permitting the men in the Naval Reserve to vote. He sought earnestly to be permitted to offer an amendment remedying this defect, and even went to the extent of voting with the Democrats against the previous question on the measure.

But the Republican leaders were anxious to have the measure sent to the Senate as promptly as possible, and no opportunity was offered Mr. McIntire to offer his amendment. He was told, after the passage of the bill, that he was entirely right in the stand he had taken, and was asked to prepare an amendment extending the franchise to the Naval Reserve. The amendment will be added to the bill in the Senate, and, if understood, will be accepted in the House.

While he was thus engaged in his fight for the rights of the Naval Reserve, Mr. McIntire received a telegram from Col. Dunwoody, of the Signal Service, requesting him to notify the Baltimore detachment of Signal Service men to report in Washington today, to be mustered into service.

The Signal Service men encamped with the rest of the Maryland National Guard at Camp Williams, but they were not accepted for service. The men will report at the Washington barracks, where they will be mustered into the federal service. Later, the commanding officer, will not accompany them, as he has been appointed a first lieutenant in the Fourth (Immune) Regiment, and will recruit a company of Immunes at Baltimore.

Killed by a Live Wire.
New York, June 10.—James Thompson, of Port Richmond, S. I., after drinking a glass or two of beer last night, climbed up an electric light pole, and, sitting on a cross arm, addressed the crowd. He asked his hearers why they did not follow him. He slid down and then climbed up again, inviting everybody to go up with him. Attempting to come down again, he got tangled up in live wires. He received a shock and fell head first to the curbstone. He was picked up dead.


