Stationmaster Crushed to Death. Philadelphia, Nov. 10.—Samuel Harris, stationmaster of the Pennsylvania Railroad at Camden, was crushed to death yesterday morning under a freight train. He was preparing newspaper bundles to be placed on South Jersey trains when the freight train was backed down on one of the tracks.

The train was given such momentum that before it could be stopped it had crushed through the obstruction placed at the end of the track and the caboose ran far out on the platform. Several employees, attracted by the sound of crashing timber, ran to the scene and were hurrying to see the mangled form of the aged stationmaster wedged between the front axle of the caboose and the piling at the end of the track.

Mr. Harris must have been killed almost instantly as his skull and chest were found to be crushed and one arm broken.

Life Worth Twenty Dollars. Louisville, Ky., Nov. 10.—The assertion of Judge Baker, of the criminal court, Monday that life is of less value than \$20 in Louisville has started a warm discussion here. Chief of Police Jacob Hinger protests that the immunity of criminals is not chargeable to the police. He says: "I do not think there are more murders in Louisville than in other cities of the same size with the same proportion of colored population."

SPAIN'S SCARLET STORY

Secrets Unfolded in the Official Red Book.

LEE'S RECALL DEMANDED

Efforts Before the War to Engage France as an Ally Against American-Archbishop Ireland's Visit to the President in Behalf of Peace. Appeals to European Governments.

New York, Nov. 10.—A Washington correspondent of the Herald telegraphed to this paper as follows:

I have received today a copy of the official Red Book of the government of Spain containing all the official documents and letters which passed between the government at Madrid and the two Spanish ministers to the United States, Senor Dupuy de Lome and Senor Polo y Bernabe, from April 20, 1906, until the declaration of war in 1917, and the recall of the last named ambassador.

The first official document is a transmission by Senor Dupuy de Lome of the tender made by President Cleveland through Secretary of State Olney of the good offices of the United States in seeking to terminate the war in Cuba, April 20, 1898, and the reply of the Spanish secretary of state on May 22, expressing thanks, but refusing the offer.

From that time no important messages were transmitted by Senor De Lome until June 20, 1907, after the inauguration of President McKinley. Then the official note of Secretary Sherman upon the reports of General Weyler's reconcentration proclamation was reported, with the fact that the Spanish minister had called the attention of the American government to filibustering expeditions. Two days later Senor De Lome reported that he had informed the American government that the reports of the sufferings of Cubans because of the reconcentration provision had been greatly exaggerated.

Senor De Lome on September 16, 1899, reported that the new administration would recall General Lee from Havana, and that he had received the assurances of President McKinley that he would not permit the agitation of the Cuban question.

A dispatch from Senor De Lome on November 2, 1907, denounced former Minister Hannis Taylor for his utterances, declaring they were simply made for political effect, as Mr. Taylor desired an elective office at the hands of the people. This was practically the first of De Lome's attacks upon the public men of the United States, which terminated with his statement regarding President McKinley and resulted in a demand for his recall.

and that "the officials and the members of the cabinet, even if they do not say so, are nevertheless doing their best to bring faith in Spain's ability to establish peace in Cuba."

In the same message Senor De Lome stated that he had a long conversation with a correspondent in Washington, in which he was asked what steps Spain would take if the United States sent a warship to Havana, owing to the failure of autonomy and for the protection of the American consulate and American citizens. He said: "I told him that we would fire upon the ship and never submit like Crete and Corfu."

Senor De Lome at the same time stated that he believed that the President would send a ship to Havana if he saw no other way in the difficult situation, and he said that he would not be afraid to take such a step, and said such action would create great prejudice against Spain.

Shortly after this Senor Gullon called to Senor De Lome.

"I look that at your first convenient opportunity you call the attention of the United States government to the inaccurate information reported in the States, and constantly partial conduct, and ask for its recall."

On the same day Senor De Lome wired Senor Gullon that the crisis had been reached in Congress by the speech of Representative Hitt in the House. He ended this message by stating that he thought McKinley and Lee in regard to the failure of autonomy in Cuba.

On January 21, De Lome wired that Assistant Secretary Day had assured him that the President had so highly regarded the relations and negotiations between the United States and Spain that he had decided to send a battleship to Havana as a proof of the friendship of the United States.

Two days later the Spanish secretary of state notified Mr. Woodford that the friendly visit of the Maine would be returned by a Spanish battleship visiting a port of the United States. After this Senor De Lome reported that at the annual dinner given by the President to the diplomatic corps the President had said to him:

"The Republicans were disciplined and he had a strong backing in Congress, and that as the situation had grown better during the past year Spain had nothing to do but be satisfied and have confidence."

The Spanish secretary of state, on February 8, 1908, sent a note to the powers declaring that the situation in Cuba in the United States had not changed, but that the ostentatious concentration of the American naval forces in the neighborhood of Cuban waters and the persistence with which the Maine and the Montgomery were continuing to remain in such close proximity to Cuba was causing great excitement and consternation, and expressed fear that "by some accident a conflict might be precipitated."

Upon the same date a cablegram was sent by Senor De Lome telling of the letter which caused his recall from the United States. He admits expressing his opinion of President McKinley and says that he has fearlessly done so, and has been more modest than have been the Americans in expressing their opinion of Spain's affairs in Cuba.

Remembering the Maine. One of the first acts of Senor De Lome, as charge d'affaires, was to communicate to Madrid that great activity was being shown in the arsenal and that Congress had adopted a resolution making a large appropriation for fortifications. In the matter of the blowing up of the Maine, Du Bose, on February 25, declared in a message that the most conservative and influential men had lost their heads, and that all were anxiously awaiting the result of the investigating committee. He said:

It can be proven that the catastrophe was the result of an accident. I believe it can be assured that actual danger can be averted, but if, on the contrary, it is shown that the deed was committed at the hands of criminals, then we are placed in a very grave position."

On March 5 Senor Gullon called Du Bose that the proposition to send help to
