THE HOT SPRINGS REPORT

Superintendent Little's Interesting Annual Document.

The Number of Visitors to the Government Reservation at the Largest in Its History—Doctors Who Employ Drummers to Gather in Patients—Fetters of the Free Bath.

The report of the superintendent of the Hot Springs reservation, Ark., made yesterday, is one of the most interesting documents received this year by the Secretary of the Interior.

The superintendent, William J. Little, reviewing the conditions of this most important Government reservation, says the number of persons visiting Hot Springs for health and pleasure during the year has been by far the largest in the history of the place.

The hotels and bathhouses have done a large business, and those using the baths have been greatly benefited. Congress has set aside four sections of land embracing the hot waters and reserved them for future disposal of the United States.

The hot springs, seventy-three in number, issue from the side and base of Hot Springs Mountain, the western end of which is secured at the source and conveyed through pipes laid underground to the bathhouses and reservoir. For the daily supply of the bathhouses, 200,000 gallons are required, the supply for each tub being 1,600 gallons per day.

With the increased attention directed to Hot Springs, a quantitative analysis of the water is demanded for more specific information. Especially is this noted in the requirements for an authoritative analysis of the hot waters.

The free bathhouse is operated under the provisions of the act of Congress approved December 16, 1878, which provides that the superintendent shall supply a sufficient number of free baths for the indigent poor.

The whole number of baths given during the year has been 147,713, the daily average for the time during which the house was open for bathing being 528, divided as follows: White men, 244; white women, 21; colored men, 117; colored women, 36.

TO SHOOT OUT CONTAGION

The New York Health Officer's Mission in Europe.

Dr. Doty Will Endeavor to Prevent the Sailing of Immigrants Infected With Dangerous Diseases—Foreign Officials Not Careful in Their Inspection of Poor Ship Passengers.

NEW YORK, Oct. 6.—Dr. A. H. Doty, health officer of the port, will sail for Europe on Tuesday next to consult with the authorities at the principal ports where emigrants for this country embark.

"We are getting a poor class of Russians here," said Dr. Doty yesterday, "who are giving us a great deal of unnecessary trouble. The trouble could easily be avoided if the health officers and the officials of the steamship companies at foreign ports, especially at Bremen, will agree upon a more careful examination of emigrants bound for this country."

A little care in co-operation between the foreign health officers and the steamship folks would accomplish what is now done. The latter could put up a sort of boarding house as a place of detention at Bremen, and it would cost them less money than it does now when they bring over a stowaway full of infected people.
