A NEW CATHOLIC SAINT

The Catholics of this city and the Brothers of the Christian Schools especially, are looking forward with eager interest to May 24 next, when Pope Leo XIII will proclaim to the Christian world the canonization of Jean Baptiste de la Salle.

"The Blessed de la Salle," said a prominent member of the Christian Brothers in this city today, "should have lived in the present time. As it is he was more than two centuries ahead of his age, and in founding our order he showed himself so emphatically devoted to the most advanced ideas in education, that great as was the mission he performed we think there is still need of such a man."

The canonization ceremony, which will be conducted by the Pope in person, should his health enable him to do so, will take place at St. Peter's in Rome, and will be the culmination of the honors already conferred on de la Salle, who was declared Venerable upon May 18, 1810, by Pope Gregory XVI, and received the degree of Blessed February 19, 1888. The last named declaration is usually precedent to canonization.

The same prof of eminent virtue and the working of miracles is demanded in one case as in the other, the only difference being that the cultus of a canonized saint belongs to the universal church instead of a particular order, or community, and aims may be erected in his or her honor throughout the Christian world.

The elevation of Jean Baptiste de la Salle, through the successive stages of Venerable and Blessed to the dignity of a canonized saint has been going on in France, his native country, and in Rome, the center of such process, for the greater part of this century. The enquiry instituted for declaring him Venerable was conducted simultaneously at Rheims, his birthplace, Rome, and the Vatican, and the requisite for the degrees of Blessed and Saint are the proofs of miracles wrought by the Venerable person who is nominated for these honors. There, it is said, have been reported by the faithful, and approved by John Baptiste de la Salle, and hence there are no obstacles to his enrollment in the catalogue of saints.

MISSING FROM HOME.

Disappearance of Two Persons Reported to the Police.

The police have been requested to look out for two missing persons who are reported to have left their homes without apparent cause.

George B. Bessler, who resides with his parents at 112 Seventh Street northwest, left home Sunday afternoon last, and efforts to locate him have so far proved unavailing. Yesterday the police were asked to assist in the search, and a lookout for the missing boy has been posted to the various stations. A request was made of the police last night to locate Dora Warren, twenty-four years old, who has disappeared from her home in Park Avenue northwest. She is described as about five feet nine inches tall, with black hair, blue eyes, and fair complexion.

THE ALASKAN MOUNTAINS.

The Greatest of Them All Called After President McKinley.

The Geological Survey has in course of preparation a bulletin on the "Altitudes of Alaska." It has been compiled by the Geographer of the Survey, Henry Gannett, and contains among many others the names of the following mountains: Blackburn Mountain, 12,500 feet; Black Mountain, 12,500 feet; Cook Mountain, 13,750 feet; Crillon Mountain, 15,900 feet; Drum Mountain, 13,200 feet; Fairweather Mountain, 15,200 feet; Hayes Mountain, 11,500 feet; Hinnam Peak, 12,600 feet; Kibik Mountain, 10,000 feet; La Perouse Mountain, 10,700 feet; Latuya Mountain, 11,850 feet; McKinley Mountain, 20,454 feet; Saint Elias Mountain, 18,024 feet; Sanford Mountain, 12,900 feet; Seattle Mountain, 10,000 feet; T. Man Mountain, 13,300 feet; Vancouver Mountains, 15,000 feet; Wrangell Mountain, 17,500 feet.

The mountain which is now known as Mount McKinley was formerly known as Mount Alton. It is visible from the coast of Cook Inlet, about 200 miles away, and the inhabitants of that region call it "Berlasega," which is the corrupted Russian version of the name of the mountain. The real name of the mountain is "Talega." Mr. Dick, a prospector, named this mountain after President McKinley in the year 1896 and it has been thus inscribed on the new maps of Alaska issued by the Geographic Survey.
