RED MEN FILE A CLAIM

The Demands of the Absentee Shawnee Indians.

They Allege That the Government Deprived Them of Their Homes Without Remuneration...

M. J. Butley, an Indian agent, has been in this city for several weeks endeavoring to effect a settlement of the claims of the Absentee Shawnee Indians.

The Shawnee Indians were granted land in the present State of Missouri, by the Spanish Government after having been driven from their Eastern homes...

They fought with Texas in their war for independence and served with the Texas troops in the gathering together of the suppressed wild tribes of that locality.

They were given by the Government of Texas for their services, a reservation forty miles square, where they remained until they were removed to the Indian Territory...

They were near the present site of Wichita, Kans., and furnished to the Fourteen Kansas Cavalry companies of men and horses.

But in 1870 another tribe of Indians was to be located upon this particular tract of land occupied by them, and soldiers were sent to remove these Shawnees, which they did, burning their houses and fences behind them.

The claim of the Absentee Shawnee is now being briefed in complete form by Richard C. Adams, who is empowered to act as attorney for the Shawnee tribe.

PETITION OF DOG OWNERS

Commissioners Asked to Rescind the Muzzle Order.

Citizens Hold a Lively Meeting, at Which the Action of the District Authorities is Discussed—The Fair Sex Well Represented at the Gathering—A Reply to Mr. Moss.

The meeting which was called for last night at the National Rifles Armory by George W. Evans for the supporters of the petition for rescinding the dog-muzzling order was well attended.

George A. Hill, of the Naval Observatory, said there had been a society regularly organized for the same purpose, which had a full set of officers, and which already had taken steps toward the attainment of the end in view.

Denial of O'Connor, at this juncture, moved to elect Mr. Evans chairman of the meeting and the motion was carried.

The chairman then read a statement of the sum of which the dog owners of the District were being "muzzled."

Mr. Hill, of the Naval Observatory, objected to the order, and his "brute catchers," Mr. Evans alleged that "dog owners paid \$17,000 tag money and \$3,000 for redeeming impounded dogs, more than half the amount appropriated by Congress for the support of the Health Department of the District."

Mr. Avery, of Massachusetts, moved that the meeting be adjourned to reconvene at the call of the chairman.
