

STOCK DEALINGS LIGHT

The Market Opens Fractionally Higher With Limited Trading.

Slight Reaction Caused by a Material Rally in London Operations.

The Industrial Quarter Unusually Neglected—Sugar Refining and the Steel Shares Without Animation.

NEW YORK, June 11.—Although consols were fractionally lower today, the general London market, including the American quarter, rallied materially from a early depression.

Chiefly on this account, the local market opened fractionally higher for the railway list, but with the dealings in very light volume.

There was very little trading in Sugar during the day and that little was mostly in selling for the short account.

There was some little trading in Northern Pacific during the day, but no great change was shown in the prices.

An Independent Pipe Line Soon to be Operated. PHILADELPHIA, June 11.—An independent pipe line from the oil regions to the seaboard is expected to be in operation by October 1, the complete right of way having been secured.

OFFICIAL INVESTIGATION OF THE TROLLEY CAR COLLISION TO BEGIN TODAY

PROVIDENCE, R. I., June 11.—The official investigation into the cause of the trolley car collision at Old Warwick station, in which four persons were killed and twenty-six injured, yesterday will begin today.

THE COMPANY NOW HAS IN OPERATION A FIVE-INCH PIPE FOR REFINED OIL AND A FOUR-INCH PIPE FOR CRUDE OIL FROM BRADFORD FREEMANBURG, A DISTANCE OF 320 MILES, WITH A CAPACITY OF 27,000 GALLONS PER DAY.

From Freemanburg the pipes will be extended eastward to Marcus Hook, Delaware County, a distance of sixty-two miles. The right of way for a complete line to the eastern terminus at Marcus Hook has been secured, and riparian property with 1,000 feet frontage has been purchased from the Reading Railway at Marcus Hook.

Mr. Ellis states that the chain is now complete and that by next fall the independent company will be shipping oil to foreign ports in its own tank steamers.

The company now owns four of the largest tankers, each of 2,500 tons, and the time the line is completed it will be in possession of a full complement of vessels for trade.

The adjoining property on the Delaware River front has been purchased by the Union Trusting Company, which is at present erecting wharves and other buildings while an independent corporation, will cooperate with the new pipe line company.

It is also expected to be ready for business by October 1, and will have a 6 per cent annual, payable semi-annually, payable by the new corporation, which will be in a position to enter into a business arrangement with the pipe line for mutual advantages.

The refining and marketing stamps are purchased a plot of ground, 450 feet along the river, and 2,000 feet deep, from the Reading Railroad Company. The wharfage privileges have been secured, and both the new corporation and the independent wharf facilities. The new pipe line will run through this section, several miles west of Philadelphia, and will reach the eastern terminus at Marcus Hook.

Mr. Ellis says the line is as direct as the topography and the geography of the country through which it runs would permit, and which he believes will be the most complete in the world.
