IN THE POLICE COURT
 Prisoners and Morbid Spectators Swelter for Two Hours.

The usual motley crowd packed the dock in the lower branch of the Police Court this morning, and the regular quota of the morbidly curious huddled together on the benches which are supposed to be reserved for witnesses. The prisoners suffered in the suffocating atmosphere of the poorly ventilated courtroom because they could not help themselves. The spectators, however, tolerated the intense heat as a matter of choice and sat for two hours mopping perspiration simply to gratify a desire to look on the unfortunate side of life.

The first offender arraigned was William M. Gorm, fifty-two years of age, whose pale and wan face indicated a recent serious illness. Gorm was charged with vagrancy and Policeman Evans alleged the defendant was found in the street drunk and begging. The policeman charitably added that an investigation made by him revealed the existence of mitigating circumstances. In his defense Gorm stated that about three months ago, while employed in Philadelphia, he suffered an attack of typhoid pneumonia which resulted in a mental aberration and a confinement in an insane asylum. "I was released Wednesday," said Gorm, "and I am on my way to Oakland, Va., where my home is located. If I can get to Alexandria an uncle will help me home."

Gorm explained that his profane language toward Policeman Evans was due to the irresponsible conduct of the latter, said he was sorry for his conduct and had apologized for it. Judge Scott was favorably impressed with Gorm and released him on his personal bonds to leave the city.

Patrick Allen, colored, was accused of riding his bicycle on Ninth Street at a greater rate of speed than that allowed by law. Policeman Bode declared that Allen propelled his bicycle at twenty miles an hour. Allen entered a plea of guilty and claimed that he was on an excessive speed. Judge Scott imposed a fine of \$5, and on hearing that Allen had only \$2 in his possession, extended greater leniency and accepted the extent of Allen's wealth as a penalty for his offense.

Emanuel Franklin, a venerable looking gentleman, with flowing gray locks and beard, worn after the style of Benjamin Franklin, was the complainant against William Gill and Harry Codrick, who were charged with profanity and disorderly conduct. It was alleged that the accused white drunk appeared at his house and tore down certain vines, broke a screen door, and were generally disorderly and profane. Gill denied that he was guilty and Codrick admitted the charge. Each defendant was ordered to pay the \$10 or go to the workhouse for thirty days. Both went down.

William Moxley and Albert Joy were the defendants in a charge of vagrancy, and Joy was confronted by the additional charge of assaulting a citizen. It was alleged that the accused accosted the citizen and demanded \$10 for "protection." The demand was refused, and Joy, it was said, after announcing that he intended to get the money at any cost, assaulted the citizen. Joy admitted the charge, but denied committing the assault. Judge Scott imposed an aggregate sentence of eight months. Moxley denied his guilt, but the evidence against him was so strong that he will keep Joy company for ninety days. Vagrancy was charged against Delsey Hill, who entered a plea of guilty and went down for a period of thirty days.

The honesty of William Honesty, a colored boy, made a good impression on Judge Scott, with the result that the small fine of \$2 was imposed on him for riding on Washington Circle. Park Policeman Steele alleged that the lives of children and nurses were endangered by the reckless throwing of stones by Honesty. The boy admitted his guilt.

Policeman Hollidge was the complainant against John Ryan, who was charged with vagrancy. According to Hollidge, Ryan was drunk on the street at 6 o'clock this morning. Ryan denied the allegation and claimed that it would have been impossible to get drunk so early in the morning. In default of payment of a fine of \$10 Ryan went down for thirty days.

Cruelty to animals was alleged against Lewis Branch, colored, who it was alleged, cruelly beat and worked a horse yesterday with the result that the animal died last night. Branch entered a plea of not guilty, but could not explain the conduct alleged by Humane Officer Haynes, and was sent down for thirty days.
