

A SIX-MASTED SCHOONER

The Queen of All Sailing Vessels Soon to Be Launched.

The Largest Ever Built—345 Feet Long and Will Carry 5,000 Tons of Coal—To Be Named the George W. Wells and Commanded by the Famous Captain Crowley.

BANGOR, Me., Aug. 12.—The largest schooner in the world, the first six-masted ever built, will be launched at the yard of Harvey M. Bean, at Camden, Me., on Tuesday, August 14. This is the schooner George W. Wells, owned by Capt. John G. Crowley, of Taunton, Mass., and parties in New York, Fall River, and Southbridge, Mass., and to be commanded by Capt. Arthur Crowley, now of the five-masted schooner John B. Prescott.

The keel of this monster schooner was laid on April 1. She is now practically completed as a hull, but such is her weight that the masts will not be put in until after she has been launched for fear that the blocks upon which she rests, now crushed almost flat, would collapse altogether.

Many giant schooners have been built in American yards in recent years, but none of these now afloat approaches the George W. Wells in size. She is 345 feet long on the keel, 345 feet long on the top, 48 feet 6 inches beam and 23 feet deep. She has two full decks, with a poop 4 feet deep, and a foremast 13.5 inches tall to the forward hatch.

So great is the sweep of her deck that the vessel's houses, although of generous size, look very small. Her after house is 12 feet square, and the foremast is 12 inches forward the engine house and forecastle, while she also has a wheelhouse for use in heavy weather, and a cabin 13.5 inches high aft, running up to a height of 17 feet forward.

LOST IN AN OLD MINE

Perilous Adventure of a Company of Young Persons.

Three Girls and a Youth Seek to Explore an Abandoned Old Shaft and Lose Their Way—In Darkness for Over Eight Hours—Rescued From the Cavern by a Search Party.

LAKE HOPATCONG, N. J., Aug. 12.—Miss Lillian Lavall, of Easton, Pa.; Miss Mabel Corley, of Brooklyn; Miss Maud Miller, of New York, and Fred Schurtz, of Newark, N. J., had a remarkable escape yesterday from a dreadful and lingering death.

There are a number of old iron mines long since abandoned in this vicinity because of the great cost of extracting the ore.

After luncheon Miss Lavall, Miss Corley and Miss Miller, accompanied by Mr. Schurtz, started from the Laurel House to explore the mine at Point Comfort. Some of the boarders at the hotel tried to dissuade them from going into the mine without a guide, but the explorers started gaily off, Miss Lavall said. "If we are not back by dinner time, 7 o'clock, you can organize a party and come to our rescue."

The party took bicycle lanterns which would burn about two and a half hours. During the afternoon many were the jokes about the party and their rescue.

When 9 o'clock came a party of men started to find what had become of the girls and their escort. A stop was made at the Point to pick up a guide.

At 10 o'clock the party of the mine was reached—a gloomy hole in the side of the hill. Here the guide connected each member of the party with a cord, so that they would not become separated in the labyrinth of underground passages which he had begun a short distance from the mouth of the mine.

The party was well supplied with lanterns and carried a reserve supply of oil. From the start inside the mine there were frequent shouts, but no reply broke the silence that followed.

It was not until the rescuing party had been walking for an hour and, according to the guide, had gone some three miles into the underground depths that there came a faint response in the shape of a glad wailing shriek. Hurrying forward the five minutes' party of men found a large square chamber cut out of the solid rock, from which radiated twelve passages.

The four young people had been in darkness in the rock chamber for nearly eight hours. They had tried each one of the numerous exits, as they thought, by taking their bearings in the utter blackness, but found that they ended nowhere.
