BLACK SMOKE NUISANCE

A Letter to the District Commissioners on the Subject.

E. B. Moore, Proprietor of the Savoy. Says He Has Tried Two Consuming Devices, One of Which Works Fairly Well—Asks to Be Informed Whether He Has Met Requirements

The Commissioners have received from E. B. Moore, the proprietor of the Savoy apartment house, a letter with reference to the abatement of the smoke nuisance.

He explains to the Commissioners that the nuisance is caused by the letter of the Health Officer a more prompt reply. This letter inquired of him what steps had been taken by him to comply with the law since August 2, 1899.

"In response to this inquiry," says Mr. Moore, "I am pleased to give you an account of the efforts I have made to abate the smoke nuisance, and of the course I have further in view to that end, and I trust it may result in my enlightenment, and that of others who earnestly desire to comply with the law, as to the means available for putting our premises in condition to prevent or correct these involuntary infractions of the law, and at the same time not place upon us expensive burdens that in some instances would be almost insupportable."

After the decision in the test cases of William B. Moses & Sons, I had had coal for two months or more burned hard coal at an increased cost for fuel of 100 per cent. Finding this increased cost of fuel was not a profitable one, and also that it was difficult to keep the requisite amount of steam at all times on account of softer combustion, I returned to the use of soft coal, believing that any requirement would soon be issued by you that would allow me to adopt and place in my furnace some device that would so far consume or prevent the smoke as to meet reasonable compliance with the law, and at the same time not make an impossible requirement upon me.

"The law prohibits the emission of 'dense black or grey smoke' during the duration of the same. No amount of smoke, however, is to be emitted, and the law is being charged with fresh coal, which operation requires ordinarily from one to two minutes, nor for a brief interval, probably twenty to thirty seconds after the fire-box has been closed.

"The devices I had placed on the furnaces of the Astoria have given reasonable satisfaction to myself, and I trust to the Health Department, as I have had no complaint of the smoke there, and I understand that the smoke inspectors have made tests of the duration of the smoke after the fire-box has been closed, and that they found a satisfactory compliance with the law, as then interpreted by the Health Department.

"Believing that the smoke consuming devices placed in the furnaces at the Astoria, if kept in good order and used after each firing, would afford about the nearest possible approach to a smokeless smoke consumer, and that you would conclude this to be as strict a compliance with the law as could have been contemplated by the lawmakers, have partially arranged to have similar devices placed in the furnaces of the Savoy, but as no regulation has yet been issued by you or the Health Department relating to the smoke law I have hesitated to incur the additional expense of several hundred dollars for each boiler until I should know with reasonable certainty whether the Health Department would require the Savoy and they should be kept in order and operative, and which should cut off the smoke, say within one minute after closing the fire-box of the furnace or, allowing two minutes for firing, would not allow the escape of dense black or grey smoke at any time, say exceeding three minutes, whether such a device would conform such compliance with the law as to you would seem reasonable and just. If so I am ready to have them put in within three days from the receipt of such information from you.

"I am exceedingly anxious to give a hearty compliance with the law, but know of no way with my reach to do the same, unless by the use of a smoke consuming device that will consume and destroy the smoke within about the time named after the beginning of each firing."

Mr. Moore's letter has been noted by the Commissioners and filed for reference when the consideration of the smoke law shall be next taken up.
