restrictions. In few States exceptions to the laws prohibiting export are also made in the case of birds and animals intended for propagation, as noted below.

"Among game birds the most general prohibition is that against export of quail. All but twelve of the States prohibit export of these birds. Among the exceptions are seven Southern States, Montana and North Dakota; but Montana and North Dakota prohibit the killing of quail at all seasons, and all those west of the Mississippi River, except six, also prohibit export of pinnated grouse or prairie chickens.

"The penalties for violation of the provisions governing transportation are as a rule much heavier than those for killing or sale of game. In Idaho it is unlawful for any railway, express company, stage line, or other public carrier to receive or transport any live animal or bird intended for propagation.

"In some States the prohibition against export is so broad as to include not only dead game but also live animals and birds intended for propagation. Legislation aimed directly at the sale of live game for such purposes is found in at least one State, Montana, which declares that any person who shall wilfully catch, trap, or otherwise restrain for the purpose of sale or domestication, or any other purpose, any buffalo, elk, moose, or mountain sheep shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

"The circular concludes by calling attention to the following general provisions: 'In the majority of States possession, transportation, or sale of game during the close season is prohibited. 'Doves are protected in a number of States, and birds other than game practically throughout the United States, at all seasons.

"In Missouri non-residents are not permitted to hunt, and they are required to obtain licenses in the following States: Arkansas, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Maryland, North Carolina, Ohio, and Pennsylvania. Anne Arundel, Calvert, Frederick, Montgomery, Washington, and Worcester, Maryland (all counties except Allegany, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Frederick, Montgomery, Washington, and Worcester).

AUSTRALIAN CIVIL LAW

Rules of Procedure Under the Code of New South Wales.

Actions Not Criminal Usually Tried by a Jury of Four Persons, But Upon Cause Being Shown to a Judge in Chambers the Number May Be Increased to Twelve.

The rapidly expanding business relations subsisting between Australia and Great Britain and other countries naturally imparts a certain amount of interest to the details of the working of the civil law at the Antipodes. In New South Wales, according to Mr. Coghlan, the Government's chief legal officer, the chief legal tribunal is the Supreme Court, which is at present composed of seven judges, viz. a chief justice and six puisne judges. Civil actions are usually tried by a jury of four persons, but they apply to a judge in chambers to have the number of jurors required to sit on the case as chosen by lot, from a panel summoned by the sheriff, and from that number each of the parties strikes out a fourth, the remainder thus selected by both parties forming the jury who are to try the case. The jury are constituted the judges of the facts of the case only, being bound to accept the dicta of the judge on all points of law. From the court thus constituted an appeal lies to what is called the "High Court," which is generally composed of at least three of the judges. The chief justice, or, in his absence, the senior puisne judge, presides over the full court, which gives the decision by majority.

The circumstances under which new trials are granted are: Where the judge has erroneously admitted or rejected material evidence; where he has wrongly directed the jury on a point of law; where the verdict of the jury is clearly against evidence; or where, from some other cause, there has evidently been a miscarriage of justice. The admission of a solicitor can only take place on the last day of any of the four terms into which the judicial year is divided. A solicitor who has been practicing for two months continuously may be struck off the roll, in which case it is necessary for him to give a term's notice before he can be re-admitted. A barrister who has been in practice as such for five years, having caused himself to be disbarred, can be admitted as a solicitor without examination.

The court can suspend or remove from the roll of solicitors any person who, in its opinion, has been guilty of misconduct or malpractice. The board for approval of qualified persons to be admitted as barristers of the Supreme Court of New South Wales, consist of the Judges of the

Supreme Court, the Attorney General for the time being, and two elected members of the bar. Applicants must have been called a-law for three or, in the case of graduates, for two years, and have passed all examinations prescribed by the board. The number of barristers practicing in New South Wales in 1900 was 148. A Queen's Counsel is appointed by a commission signed by the Governor, upon a recommendation made by the Attorney General to the Executive Council. Nine barristers held this appointment during 1900. Seven barristers who received an annual salary of £1,000 were appointed as Crown Prosecutors at the Courts of Quarter Sessions, and one at the Central Criminal Court. Others, who are paid by fees, are specially appointed, on the recommendation of the Attorney General, for each sitting of the Circuit Courts.
