FACTORS WIDELY APART

No Signs of Agreement Among the Delaware Republicans.

Rumors of All Kinds of Deals Afloat on the Day of the Meeting of the Legislature—The Senatorship as Much of a Puzzle as Ever—Addicks Supremely Confident of Success.

DOVER, Del., Jan. 1.—In advance of the meeting of the General Assembly, which opened here today, rumors of high and low degree poured into the capital all day yesterday, and last night the rotunda of the Capital Hotel, the Democratic headquarters, and the Richardson House, the Republican headquarters, were thronged.

Not for a decade has the same interest been manifested in a meeting of the Delaware Legislature as has been shown this year. This State for the past ten years has been a political hotbed where factions have thrived and struggled for supremacy.

The main fight upon which all eyes are centered is the struggle of John Edward Addicks to secure a seat in the United States Senate. As in past years he is opposed by Colonel Henry A. Dupont, who is determined to prevent the gratification of Addicks' ambition at any cost.

The Democrats can muster 22 votes without Senator E. H. F. Farlow, of Sussex county, who holds for Addicks two years ago, against a Democrat. While this number is 5 votes short of that required to elect a United States Senator on a joint ballot, they are not without a possibility of success.

FATHER'S HUNT FOR HIS BABY.

Little One Had Been Kidnapped by the Mother-in-Law.

CHICAGO, Ill., Jan. 1.—After believing for many weeks that his one-year-old baby was dead, Paul Washau found the child at St. Vincent's Infant Asylum.

Instead of going to her husband, Mrs. Washau came to Chicago and went to her home in Lincoln Park Boulevard. She had been living in Chicago for some time.

THE QUAKER CITY CORONER.

A Record of His Work During the Past Year.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 1.—The coroner's annual report, compiled by Chief Clerk J. W. Kittinger, and which was the year's work performed by Coroner Dugan, Chief Deputy Coroner Hammond, and the staff of assistants, there were 2,678 inquests held, an increase of 119 over the number in 1899.

There were 35 murder cases and 163 suicide cases investigated. Forty persons shot themselves and 25 committed suicide by hanging.

The intense heat during the summer months caused the death of 61 persons, 31 killed from heat stroke and 30 from deaths from injuries accidentally received.

DRAMATIC SCENE IN COURT.

Legal Contest of Parents for the Possession of a Child.

RICHMOND, Va., Jan. 1.—A dramatic scene was enacted in the Hastings Court yesterday morning in connection with the hearing of the habeas corpus proceedings brought to recover Gladys, the three-year-old child of Dr. and Mrs. Dorsey L. Morris.

Mrs. Morris appeared, accompanied by her brother, Mr. Spears, of Florida. Dr. Morris, followed by a colored nurse carrying a pretty blue-eyed little girl of three years, was promptly in his seat.

The counsel for Mrs. Morris argued that a state of separation did exist; that Dr. Morris had been taken to a private residence under the influence of cocaine, had left their home in Manchester ten days ago, and that he had since absented himself at his home in Boston.

YOUTHFUL RUNAWAYS CAUGHT
