

THE STEEL MARKET STRONG

NEW YORK, March 13.—The Stock Market today was characterized by London's lower range of prices being wholly ignored and active and decidedly strong.

The granger stocks were comparatively neglected and dealings in the anthracite coal group were again restricted on account of the uncertainty as to the issue of the deliberations of the Miners' Union.

Consolidated Gas was a feature of the industrial specialties in a very sharp advance. The industrial quarter was in no wise conspicuous in the larger transactions in Brooklyn Rapid Transit.

The morning's situation was altogether better than the previous day's, and there was little actual news bearing on particular stocks.

Some of the specialties advanced in respect of the monetary situation was evident, but the apprehensive influence in the market were not perceptible in the New York Stock Market.
