

THE BURLINGTON RUMORS

Early Market Strong on Revival of Talk of a Deal.

Northern Pacific and Quincy the Features—Other Railways Also Firm—A Decline Later—The Export of Gold a Subject of Comment.

NEW YORK, March 27.—Northern Pacific and Burlington and Quincy were the centres of interest in the initial dealings in the Stock Market today, though there is as yet some doubt as to the authenticity of the rumor that the control of Burlington had been acquired in the interests of the Northern Pacific.

In the remainder of the market sharp advances in contrast with yesterday's final prices were common. Southern Railway, the Atchafalaya, Missouri Pacific, Southern Pacific and the anthracite coal stocks were all conspicuously strong. Louisville and Nashville also recovered sharply and further advances were noted in the Chicago and Alton issues.

Very little was done in the industrial quarter with the exception of Sugar, which again underwent indecisive movements. Among the specialties Amalgamated Copper was dealt in at small price changes and People's Gas was decidedly firm.

The local traction shares which were fairly active moved in line with the remainder of the market, but after the initial dealings effective pressure developed throughout the day.

A factor of some weight in the strength displayed in the early dealings was the tendency of the London market, where advances extending to one point were noted in the export of gold announced in the London newspapers, but the possibilities of the money market again came in for active discussion.

Heavy profit realizing sales appeared after the initial advance, which was general and material recession was noted in prices.
